This is the final issue of Volume 11 of the My EDGE Newsletter. That means the time has come for our annual Bracketology Article. This is where we take a departure from picking pointspread winners and help you fill out your NCAA Tournament bracket so that you can win your office pool. It goes without saying that the upcoming three weeks are our favorite time of year and that this article is something we look forward to writing each and every year.

Ask around and you'll quickly hear of our yearly success with this article. Last season, we had Duke making it to the National Title Game and also had West Virginia in the Final Four. In 2009, we correctly predicted that North Carolina would win it all, just like we did in 2005 when they beat Illinois (we predicted that exact Tournament Final). In 2007, we not only had the right Tournament Final and winner (Florida over Ohio State), but we correctly projected the entire Final Four field! In 2008, we correctly predicted seven of the Elite Eight teams (only missing on Cinderella Davidson).

So, is this really the most "wide open" field in NCAA Tournament history? Last year was an upset filled tournament after back to back years, where for the most part, the chalk walked. Who do we like to cut down the nets on April 4th? Read on to find out the answer.

1st Round

Obviously, we should not need to tell you that a #1 seed has never lost to a #16 seed in 104 all-time matchups. Last year

saw top seeds go a dominating 4-0 ATS, winning every game by more than 20 points. With the advent of more "opening round" games this year, two of this year's #1 seeds now get to face teams that will have already played two days prior.

Advance all four #1 seeds to the second round.

2009 marked the first NCAA Tournament where every team seeded 1 through 3 made it to the Sweet Sixteen. Since the field was expanded to 64 teams in 1985, teams seeded 2 through 4 are a strong 169-43 SU in the first round. As you would expect, 2 seeds have the highest success rate, losing only four times to a 15 seed and the last time this happened was 2001.

Advance all four #2 seeds to the second round.

One 3 seed lost in the first round of the tournament last year and that was Georgetown, who bit the dust against Ohio U. That was the 16th all-time loss by a 3-seed in the first round. All four teams in this year's group look too strong to experience the same fate that befell the Hoyas last year.

Advance all four #3 seeds to the second round.

It's almost becoming automatic that you have to play against one 4 seed in the first round of the NCAA Tournament each year. That's because 22 of the previous 26 tournaments have seen at least one four seed go down in the first two days of the Big Dance. We called last year's upset with Murray State over Vanderbilt.

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This year's 4 seeds could be in for more trouble. Two of the 13 seeds this year, Belmont and Oakland, have already been identified by many as possible outright winners. We're going with Belmont over Wisconsin, who lost to Cornell in last year's tourney.

Advance #13 seed Belmont. Advance #4 seeds Kentucky, Louisville and Texas.

The 2007 Tournament saw all four five seeds advance to the second round, but that has been the exception to the rule as 20 of the previous 22 tournaments have seen at least one 12 seed upset a 5. Last year, it was Cornell over Temple, which we correctly predicted. The year before, there were three 12's that pulled the upset and overall there have been 35 upsets since the field was expanded in 1985. It is interesting to note that two 5 seeds last year – Butler and Michigan State – made it all the way to the Final Four. One of this year's five seeds (West Virginia) gets the benefit of facing a "play-in" game winner, so we'll take them. Two of the other five seeds we see losing.

Advance 12 seeds Richmond and Utah State. Advance 5 seeds West Virginia and Arizona.

For years, it has been noted that six seeds actually outperformed their fifth seeded counterparts. However, here too, we are seeing a litany of recent upsets. Over the last five tournaments, eight 11's have beaten a 6 (against 12 losses). Last year, a pair of 11's – Washington and Old Dominion (we called the latter) – advanced, meaning there have been 33 upsets all-time, nearly matching what we have seen from the 5 vs. 12 matchup. Like the 5 seeds last year, it is interesting to note that both six seeds that made it out of the first round won at least two games. One of this year's six seeds (Georgetown) gets the benefit of facing a play-in game winner. We love one 11 (Missouri) and one 6 (Xavier) while St. John's-Gonzaga is a coin flip.



Advance 6 Seeds: Xavier, Georgetown and St. Johns. Advance 11 seed: Missouri.

The 7 vs.10 matchup is a very important one to analyze. This is because history says at least one will reach the Sweet 16. Last year, St. Mary's continued the trend after no teams seeded 7 or 10 made it out of the second round in 2009. From 2004-08, seven seeds dominated their tenth seeded counterparts to the tune of 15-5 SU, including 7-1 SU in 2007-08. However, the last two years have seen a reversal of fortune as 10 seeds are now 6-2 SU in the first round the past two tournaments. This year we like the 7 seeds to turn the table.

Advance 7 seeds: Washington, Texas A&M and Temple. Advance 10 seed: Michigan State.

The lower seeded 9 seeds actually have a winning record vs. the 8 seeds. That being said, it's almost a 50/50 split and over the last six tournaments there has never been a 4-0 sweep by either side. The last three years have seen a 2-2 split each

time. Let's make it four straight years!
Advance 8 seeds: George Mason and UNLV. Advance 9 seeds: Tennessee and Old Dominion.

2nd Round

Going into last year, #1 seeds were on a five-year, 20-0 straight up run in second round games. Then Northern Iowa went out and ruined everyone's bracket by beating Kansas. That was the first time a #1 seed had lost in this round in seven years, when two lost, which also happened in 2000. A possible Pitt-Old Dominion matchup looks tempting for an upset, but we're not biting.

Advance all four #1 seeds to the Sweet 16.

Prior to 2009, when they were a perfect 4-0, #2 seeds were a disaster in the 2nd round, going just 13-11 SU. Last year, Villanova lost to St. Mary's.

Going into last year's tournament, all four #3 seeds had advanced to the Sweet 16 in

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back to back years. Previously, we'd seen five straight seasons where at least one 3 seed did not make it out of the first weekend. Last year was a return to that form as three #3 seeds were gone after the second round. Shockingly, we will call for a repeat of 2009 as we say **advance all #2 and #3 seeds to the Sweet 16** (BYU and San Diego State most likely to be upset).

Because of upsets, you rarely get the #4 vs. #5 seed matchup in the second round. There was a pair of them three years ago with the results split. Two years ago, there was just one with #5 Purdue over #4 Washington. Last year, there was a pair and again the results were split. This year, we have a pair (Kentucky vs. WVU & Texas vs. Arizona) and we will again call for a split. Then, we have Louisville as an obvious call over Richmond and in a battle of double digit seeds in the Southeast, we'll go with Utah State.

Advance: Kentucky, Arizona, Louisville and Utah State to the Sweet 16.

Sweet 16

Let's reset our brackets. In the top halves, we have Ohio St vs. Kentucky (East), Kansas vs. Louisville (Southwest), Duke vs. Arizona (West) and Pitt vs. Utah State (Southeast). Huge break for the Panthers and we think they'll join the other three top seeds in the Elite Eight. **Advance all four seeds to the Elite 8.**

In the bottom halves, we have North Carolina vs. Syracuse, Notre Dame vs. Purdue, San Diego State vs. UConn and Florida vs. BYU, all battles of 2 vs. 3 seeds. We'll call for a split.

Advance #2 seeds North Carolina and Florida to the Elite 8. Advance #3 seeds Purdue and UConn to the Elite Eight.

Elite Eight

Last year's Sweet 16 really ruined some brackets with a pair of 5 seeds winning and a #6 beating a #2. There was only one matchup of a 1 vs. 2 and it was won by #2 West Virginia over #1 Ken-



tucky (which we called). This year, we have two (Ohio State vs. UNC and Pitt vs. Florida). We just don't like Pitt and we can't go against Ohio State (yet!).

Advance Ohio State and Florida to the Final Four.

The other two Elite Eight matchups we have a #1 against a #3 seed (Kansas vs. Purdue and Duke vs. UConn). Purdue was only a slight lean over Notre Dame, so we'll go with Kansas. Then, we will call for UConn's hot streak to continue as they upset the Dookies!

Advance Kansas and UConn to the Final Four.

Final Four

Last year was a very non-traditional Final Four with only one 1 seed, two 5 seeds and a 2 seed. This year, we have a pair of 1 seeds (Ohio State, Kansas), a 2 (Florida) and a 3 (UConn).

In our first national semifinal, we have Ohio State taking on UConn, which might be a pick that not many people in your pool have. Ohio State opened as the overall tournament favorite at 7/2 odds and will be a popular Final Four pick. Let's "buck" the crowd!

Advance UConn to the National Title Game.

Our second national semifinal is Kansas vs. Florida. Seems pretty easy to us.

Advance Kansas to the National Title Game.

National Championship

So, we've got one team here that a lot of people in your pool are going to have (Kansas) against one that not many will have (UConn). The Jayhawks really let us down last year (although many readers emailed in to tell us they still won their pool because we had Duke in the finals (no one had Butler)), so some will say we should learn our lesson. Nope. By this point, the Huskies will be tired out after winning five games in five days in the Big East Tournament last week.

Prediction: Kansas over Connecticut

Chicago at New Jersey Thursday, Mar. 17th, 7:05 ET

The beat goes on for the Bulls. Since losing their first game after the All Star Break, the Bulls have won nine of ten including two wins over Miami. They should have no trouble extending the streak this week as they play Washington at home on Tuesday night before making this trip over to New Jersey. This Bulls team is rolling and they are now tied with Boston for the best record in the Eastern Conference and three games ahead of the Heat. The Nets are playing very good basketball of late as they have won five straight games, including two wins over Toronto in London. On Monday night they upset Boston 88-79 here in New Jersey. Miami at Atlanta Friday, Mar. 18th, 7:35 ET

All is well in South Beach. Just when it looked like the ship was going to sink after five straight losses, the Heat regrouped and beat the Lakers. They then went on to bomb Memphis and on Monday night got a big revenge win over San Antonio by 30 points. They finish off their six game home stand with a tough game against Oklahoma City on Wednesday night before going to Atlanta for a one game road trip. The Hawks continue to be a very inconsistent and an underachieving team. They enter this week's action at 38-28 and third place in the Southeast Division. If

Boston at Houston Friday, Mar. 18th, 8:35 ET

The Celtics made some trades at the deadline and haven't been playing very good basketball since. The Celtics had won five straight but have gone on to lose three of their last four games. On Monday they suffered one of those losses, a 88-79 defeat to the lowly New Jersey Nets. Also, not only are the Celtics losing games SU,

but they're killing their backers with a 1-5 ATS mark over their last six games. The Rockets enter this week's action dead even on the season at 34-34 SU. They've been money winners though posting a 35-30-3 ATS record. On Monday night the Rockets held off Phoenix at home beating the Suns 95-93 but failing to cover as lofty 8-point favorites. Before this matchup against the Celtics they get Charlotte at home on Wednesday and are in the midst of a six game home stand. The first time these two teams met this season was up in Boston in the middle of January. The Celtics were playing good basketball but were shocked by the Rockets losing 108-102 as 8.5-point home favorites. Look for the Celtics to pay back the Rockets tonight in Houston. Boston is 6-1 ATS playing on the road with revenge. **3* on Boston**

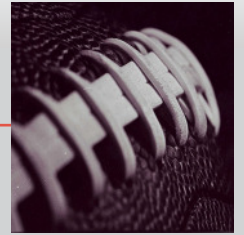
Richmond vs Vanderbilt

And that's because the Spartans have underachieved all season. Ranked #2 to start the year, Michigan State finished with a 19-14 record, and was a money-burning 11-20 ATS. In contrast, UCLA eked out a small profit for its backers, going 17-15 ATS (and 20-11 straight-up). The Bruins have covered four of their last five games, and eight of their previous 11, while MSU is on a 1-3 ATS run to end the season.

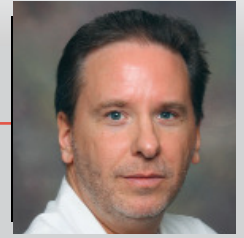


Alabama St vs TX-San Antonio
Wednesday, Mar. 16, 6:30 ET

My proprietary sports handicapping database and simulator shows a high probability that 130 or more points will be scored in this game. The Alabama State Hornets were 6-16 to start the season and then ripped off 11 victories in their last 12 games to post a final 17-17 overall record and finished 11-7 in the SWAC. In the semifinal they defeated top seed Texas Southern 73-66 and then played Grambling with a 12-21 losing record in the final. Surprisingly, they were only six point favorites in that final, but easily covered the spread winning 65-48. Supporting this graded play is a system that has produced a record of 25-9 'over' for 74% winners since 1997. Play 'over' with all teams in non-conference games where the total is between 120 and 129.5 points after beating the spread by more than six points in three consecutive games.

I'm playing the Under between Nebraska and Wichita State in Wednesday's NIT action. Nebraska gets exactly what they want for this opening round matchup. Doc Sadler's troops would like to play a low scoring, defensively dominated contest. Wichita State and their slow tempo will oblige. Nebraska is 13th in the nation allowing just 60 ppg. They're 8th in college baskets in FG percentage allowed. The Shockers allow just 61.9 ppg which is 34th best in the nation. And it must be noted that while Nebraska is a decent shooting team, they play a slow style, taking their time on the offensive end. Look for this one to stay Under the total on Wednesday.

We've uncovered a 61% supersystem in this one that says to play on favorites in a non-conference matchup between two teams from what we'll call "weak" conferences. The system has gone 63-40 ATS over the last five seasons. ASU scored a pathetic 59.2 PPG away from home this year.

You hear it every year on the tournament telecasts: somewhere, somehow, a No. 12 seed is going to bring down a No. 5. It's as reliable as death and taxes... so allow us to make a case for this particular instance of the '12 vs 5' phenomenon. First, we don't think of Utah State as a 12-seed: the Aggies are one of only SIX 30-win teams this season. They also clamp down on the defensive end, harassing foes enough to rank No. 5 nationally in Defensive Field Goal Percentage (38.3). Kansas State earned a preseason Top 10 spot on the strength of its deep run in last year's tournament (lost to Butler in Elite 8) but Frank Martin's team started slow and languished in underachievement land for most of the year - until finally getting it together down the stretch. A tough call but look for the Aggies to perpetuate the '12 vs 5' phenomenon.

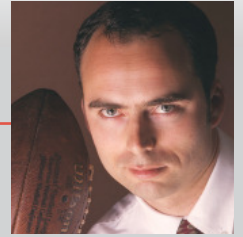
Chicago at Indiana

Still, Edmonton fans hoped for a better showing. They've got the fewest points in the entire NHL.
