## NY Giants at Detroit

Thursday, August 7th, 7:00 ET

It seems as if defending Super Bowl champions have had a real "bulls-eye" on their back in recent preseasons, going 2-10 vs. the number over the last three years. Last season, Indianapolis went 1-2-1 ATS, meaning the Patriots and the Steelers before them really stunk up the joint. This year, it's the New York Giants, one of the least likely Super Bowl Champions in history as the marked team.

They begin this preseason campaign with this Thursday nighter against Detroit, a team they beat 16-10 last preseason as the Lions threw a somewhat stunning 43 passes in the contest. Mike Martz is gone and coach Rod Marinelli wants a more run-first mentality on offense and he may finally have the personnel to do so. Top draft choice Kevin Smith, a 2,000+ yard back at Central Florida joins veterans Tatum Bell, Artose Pinner, Aveion Cason and Brian Calhoun, all of whom will be vying for the workload. The Giants defense isn't going to be what it was last year either with four departed starters, including the retired Michael Strahan, so depth will be an issue in these early preseason battles for the G-Men.

Speaking of depth, what about New York's QB situation? Eli Manning silenced the critics last year, but he'll be in for just a series or two, tops, here. Behind him are a pair of new Giants, Anthony Wright and David Carr, both of whom are obviously learning a new offense. Furthermore, just about every Giant WR has missed some part of training camp due to injury.

The Lions, meanwhile, actually have a pretty solid little QB rotation in Jon Kitna, Dan Orlovsky and Drew Stanton. Orlovsky has looked pretty good in practice from what we're hearing. Stanton, not so much, so he might play with a little something extra in the opener. On defense, this is the third year of the "Tampa Two" system and the players should be more comfortable and familiar.

Let's finalize by admitting that Detroit hasn't been all that great in recent preseasons, but since 1993, the Giants are a dreadful 4-16 against the number in pre-

season games played on turf. Lay the points with the more motivated home team here. **3\* on Detroit**

## Philadelphia at Pittsburgh Friday, August 8th, 7:30 ET

Talk about an edge in preparation. Eagles rookies reported to camp all the way back on 6/21, with the veterans following suit just three days later. The entire Steelers team didn't report until JULY 27th! While we do not doubt that the Steelers may very well be AFC North champs at the end of the year, we are doubting their preparedness for the preseason opener, which comes less than two weeks after everyone even got settled in.

Lots of water cooler talk this offseason on how Philadelphia could be a sleeper team in the NFC this year. Tough to argue since Andy Reid has never missed the postseason in consecutive years during his tenure and his team is coming off a sub-par 8-8 campaign that actually landed them in last in the NFC East. They were the only team in the division not to go to the playoffs.

Clearly, much of Philly's fortunes rest on the arm (and overall health) of Donovan McNabb. He won't be seeing much action here, but backup Kevin Kolb will. Kolb is the QB of the future in the City of Brotherly Love and the coaching staff wants him to show off the long ball this preseason. Expected a motivated effort at RB as well as backup Correll Buckhalter, who is not bad at all, should see ample time as Brian Westbrook is banged up.

At RB, you won't be seeing much of Willie Parker's breakaway speed, as the team will be trying to break in top draft choice Rashard Mendenhall, which would be fine, if not for the fact that this will be the first time Alan Faneca won't be on the offensive line in a decade.

The home team has won and covered each of the last three preseason meetings between these Keystone State rivals, but considering this is a watershed year for Andy Reid and the fact that the Steelers just got into camp not too long ago, we'll grab the points here and expect an outright win. ### Indianapolis at Carolina Saturday, August 9

Indianapolis is 80-28 straight up in the regular season under Tony Dungy. As for the Preseason it is a different story as the Colts are 3-11 ATS their last 14 preseason games and they are 1-8 ATS in their second preseason game. With Peyton Manning injured, Jim Sorgi, Quinn Gray, and Jared Lorenzen will get the snaps in the in the preseason. Manning figures to be ready to go when the regular season starts. Carolina is 6-1 ATS in Week 1 of the preseason. The Panthers 7-9 record last year didn't sit well with head coach John Fox. I for one expect a bounce back year from this team in 2008.

Vicente Padilla gave up four earned runs with a 1.50 WHIP in his last outing and hasn't been as sharp as he was to open the year. Padilla struggled in his only start versus the Orioles this season as he took the loss and compiled an ERA of 27.00 in that game. Padilla hasn't fared well in his career versus Baltimore either going just 2-4 with a 7.86 ERA and a 2.01 WHIP in five career starts. Daniel Cabrera toes the rubber today for the Orioles. Cabrera hasn't started against the Rangers this year but has struggled mightily in his career versus them. Cabrera is 1-6 with a 6.33 ERA and a 1.88 WHIP in eight careers starts versus Texas. Look for both teams to put up runs early as this one sails over the total. Play on OVER!

Yet, even that won't help them this Friday night against Bay Area rival San Francisco, whom they have gone just 1-6 ATS against in this annual preseason clash. If we're talking about J.T. O'Sullivan as a key to the game, you know it must be preseason. However, in all seriousness, O'Sullivan is someone to keep an eye on here. Currently slotted as the Niners 3rd string QB, he's likely to see a lot of action here, which is important because he knows new offensive coordinator Mike Martz's playbook due to coming over from Detroit with Martz. San Francisco is one of those teams that has a QB controversy on its hands, something that is always worth keeping an eye on during these preseason games. Alex Smith played poorly last year before getting hurt, leaving Shaun Hill to take over. That worked out as Hill led the team to a pair of wins late in the year. Both he and Smith will want to give a supreme effort in this opener in an attempt to impress Coach Mike Nolan, who is on the hotseat.

For Oakland, it's now JaMarcus Russell's time. Be careful what you wish for Silver and Black fans. Russell didn't look very good last year and you can expect inconsistencies this year. Furthermore, the offensive line has issues and little depth. There's more of a sense of urgency on the 49ers sideline and since they're also getting points, that's who we're going with here.

A new era begins in Miami. Head coach Tony Sparano is in his rookie season while director of football operations is under the watchful eye of Bill Parcells. The goal is to get better right away and that starts from game one. Tampa Bay is a veteran team and while the goal is to get back into the playoffs, it does not start in the pre-season. With such a veteran team, coaches look at young players early for roster spots and we will get a glimpse of that right away on Saturday.



Quarterback rotations are huge in the preseason and Miami is in good shape. Rookies get long looks in the exhibition games and there is already good news here. The starter, veteran Josh McCown, has shown a better command of the system and is clearly the most accurate of the three quarterbacks in camp. John Beck got a lot of experience last year as well.

On the other side for Tampa Bay, Jeff Garcia will not play against the Dolphins due to an injured calf. Head coach Jon Gruden said that he is not concerned and will be taking looks at rookie Josh Johnson as well as forgotten man Chris Simms. Going up against the Buccaneers will be a defense that is confident already. Miami has a more simplified defense and a veteran lineup that includes a couple of former Dallas players that can help with any schematic transitions.

First year head coaches are more concerned than veteran coaches when it comes to winning and losing in the exhibition season. This especially holds true in the first ever preseason game where they want to hit the ground running and bring in a winning attitude right away. This especially holds true in Miami. The Dolphins had only one victory last season and if there is any team that is going to go out and try to win in the preseason, it is the Dolphins.

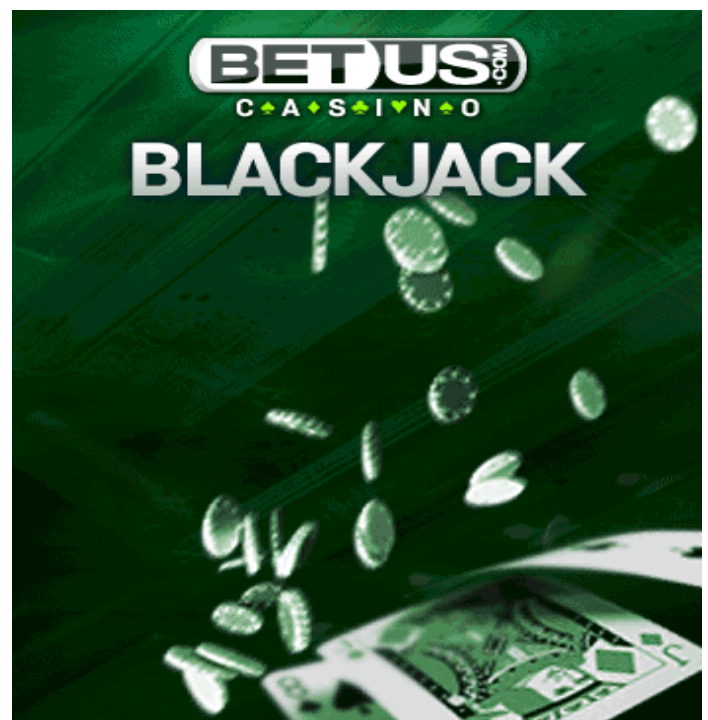
### Cleveland at Tampa Bay Wednesday, August 6

### Buffalo at Washington Saturday, August 9

Sometimes new head coaches look to prove something in their first preseason and after the Hall of Fame Game this past Sunday; one could easily make the argument that will be the case this year for Washington head coach Jim Zorn. Zorn, with NO previous head coaching experience at all, was the surprise replacement with the Redskins when Joe Gibbs retired for the second time, this past off-season. One had to be impressed with Zorn's performance last Sunday in Canton. Tony Dungy and the Colts wasted no time trying to outfox him, with an onside kick on the opening kickoff. However, the Redskins recovered at the Indy 45-yard line and three players later (in a matter of 77 seconds), Zorn had the first TD of his head-coaching career, a 20-yard pass from Jason Campbell to Antwaan Randle El. The lead didn't last long but after Indy took a 16-9 lead early in the third quarter, the Redskins shut out the Colts the rest of the way, while scoring the game's final 21 points. Colt Brennan (of Hawaii) was 9-of-10 on the game for 123 yards with two TD passes, earning a near-perfect QB rating of 157.5. The three Washington QBs combined to complete 19-of-22 passes for 213 yards (three TDs and zero INTs). Despite Portis and Betts not playing (the teams' top-two RBs), the Redskins also gained 156 yards rushing on 31 carries (5.0 YPC). Saturday night will be Zorn's home debut and I look for another outstanding effort by the Redskins against the Bills, who will probably be more interested in their game in Toronto, Canada (the team's new "home away from home!") next Thursday with the Pittsburgh Steelers.

### Indianapolis at Carolina Saturday, August 9

The Colts suffered a loss in the Hall of Fame Game on Sunday, August 3rd. However, look for that to give them an edge heading into the "true" Week 1 of the Preseason. With the Colts having an extra week this preseason, by virtue of playing in the Hall of Fame Game, they did not play their personnel versus the Redskins the way they will this week against the Panthers. Note that the Indianapolis was truly a "bad beat" for their backers on Sunday as they outgained Washington by 55 yards and they also had 24 first downs compared to just 20 for the Redskins. So, how did they lose by two touchdowns despite these solid numbers? It had a lot to do with an interception run back for a touchdown late in the game. That was the key turnover in the game. However, it was also simply a case of "laying down" a bit too early. Up 16-9 in the third quarter and seemingly "in control" of at least the "spread victory" (Indianapolis was +4.5 in most shops), the Colts somehow saw things quickly become unraveled. Even though this was "just" a Preseason game it was still the type of effort that will have Coach Dungy's troops a little hungrier this week. Keep in mind that Indianapolis saw Jim Sorgi complete 7 of 10 passes but he was an early exit from the game since the Colts were playing the first of five preseason games this year. Against the Panthers, who have yet to compete in a true game setting since last regular season, the Colts will have a physical edge as well as a mental edge. Couple that with the fact that Indianapolis is getting some decent points here and this certainly is a good spot for the dangerous dog! Note that the Colts have a well-deserved reputation recently of being a poor preseason performer but there are certain weeks where they perform better than others. For instance, coming into this season, the Colts were 5-2 ATS their last seven in Week One of the preseason. Of course, getting an extra preseason game in Week One this season means that the Colts are even more prepared for this game and, after letting one get away from them last week, Indianapolis will "close the deal" at Carolina this week. Grab the points but look for the outright upset for Indy! Note that the Panthers are just 2-7 in their last 9 as a favorite in the Preseason and we look for some sloppiness from Carolina in their first game.

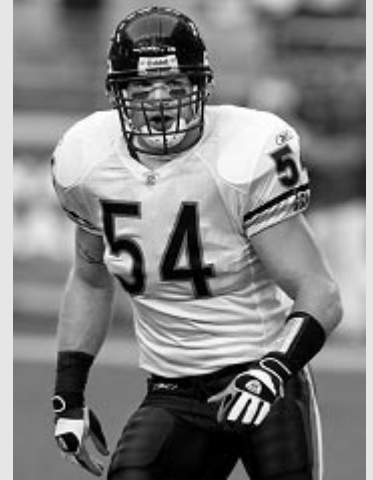

### Indianapolis at Carolina Saturday, August 9

Peyton Manning continues to stay on the sideline due to his off-season surgery. One problem was finally resolved in last weekend's Hall of Fame Game: The quarterback controversy between Manning and Jared Lorenzen has taken care of itself. No longer will Tony Dungy have to stay up late at night trying to decide who to start between the two. Okay, maybe not. But while Jim Sorgi and Quinn Gray played well and looked to have a strong grasp of the offense, the "Hefty-Lefty" proved why it's time for him to find another way to make a living.

Before Quinn Gray gave way to Lorenzen, the Colts were dominating statistically, having no trouble moving the ball between the 30s, but unable to finish strong, leading to a 16-9 lead late in the third quarter. Once again this week, pressure will be on Jim Sorgi to play well to prove he can lead the offense in case Manning isn't recovered in time to start the regular season.

The Panthers will likely spend much of the game evaluating new talent on the defensive front. Tyler Brayton (Raiders), Ian Scott (Eagles), and Darwin Walker (Bears), will all be fighting for jobs on the defensive line.

The offensive line will be interesting to keep an eye on in this one. The coaching staff urged the guards and tackles to "beef-up" during the off-season. Those who followed orders are likely to see extended time in the preseason, according to reports. The line will face a patchwork Colts' defensive front. The line, as we saw on Sunday night, is thin thanks in part to the retirement of Quinn Pitcock. The Colts also moved Raheem Brock from tackle to DE, a move that took place before Pitcock's announcement. The staff has said Brock will stick with the move, however.

So, while the Colts' defensive front may be a bit thin at the present time, I don't believe the Panthers' version we'll see in Week-One of the preseason will be capable of taking full advantage. We also know what we're going to get out of Indy's offense without Manning and Marvin Harrison. They'll likely move the ball well between the 30s again, but finishing is a different story. Last Sunday's 46 combined points gives us value in a total that I feel is too high. I look for a close to the vest, low-scoring affair by a pair of teams with several questions in regards to those who'll be on the field in this contest.

### 2008 College Football Future Selection Auburn Tigers

Auburn enters this season with high hopes for not just the SEC Title game, but also a National Championship. The SEC is divided into two divisions – East and West. Georgia is in the East and truly only has Tennessee and Florida as the only teams that have the personnel to upset them. Georgia hosts Tennessee on October 11th and Georgia will be a double digit favorite in that game. Georgia will then take on Florida on November 1st in the World's Largest Cocktail Party.

Auburn will have three tough tests on its schedule facing LSU at home on September 20th and then another home game on the 27th against Tennessee. They will face Georgia, also at home on October 15th – the week after Georgia has that home game against Tennessee. Could Georgia get caught looking ahead the week of October 11th should both teams be undefeated and in the top-5 by that date? Something to think about to be sure, but you can see how the schedule does favor Auburn. They simply have the key games on their home turf.

Auburn is implementing a new offensive scheme that will feature a more wide open offense – similar to Florida. It will be fun for the Auburn fans to see their team opening up the offense and adding a bit more risk/reward profile to the team. The days of the Bo Jackson run, run, and then run again are gone. If you look over each of the 9 years that Tuberville has been at the helm, he is most dangerous when there is a whole lot of uncertainty hanging over his team. This is most definitely the case, but he has the athletes at the skill positions and the adjustment to the new schemes has already taken place. He has 8 offensive starters returning and 7 on defense. The Tigers have been pretty good the last four years, winning 42 times and 82.4 percent of their games, fifth best in the nation in both categories. The Tigers have also won five of their last six bowl games and six consecutive games against Alabama.

Briefly, the scheme is designed to make defensive reads and take advantage of favorable matchups and what the defense is giving them. Yes, it will be more aggressive, but it will not be the Texas Tech version of the spread nor will it be the West Virginia version of the run spread.
