## Favorites or Underdogs?

What is the question this NFL Betting Season. Through the first six weeks of the 2008 regular season, favorites hold a slight 46-41 ATS EDGE (counted Week 2 game between Chicago and Carolina as a 'push'), but it has been the dogs cashing in at a higher rate these last two weeks at 16-12 ATS (8-6 ATS both weeks). What then is a bettor to do?

Well, for starters you should definitely stay away from all favorites of 10 points or more. Thanks to some research by Vegas Expert Lenny Del Genio, we know that double-digit faves are a pathetic 1-9 ATS this year. That includes a pair of non-covers by Washington and Minnesota in Week Six. Washington's outright loss (as 13.5-point favorites to the previously winless Rams) was the **FOURTH** time we've seen a team laying double-digits at the betting window lose straight up this season!

That certainly makes the Super Bowl champion Giants, Pittsburgh and Tampa Bay look pretty unattractive this week, doesn't it? The G-Men will be hosting the 49ers, losers of three straight, on Sunday. Because this is an early start, you may want to stay away from San Francisco, however. West Coast teams in early starts have been a terrible proposition all year long. Tampa Bay will be hosting Seattle in the Sunday Night Game and currently check in as a 10.5-point choice. Note that the Seahawks will be making a change at the QB position from Charlie Frye to Seneca Wallace. The Bucs come into Week 6 having covered the number in each of their last five games.

Pittsburgh has been bet up to a 10-point favorite in Cincinnati this week. The Bengals remain as one of two winless teams in the entire league (Detroit is the other) and are

averaging just 9.5 PPG at home. Even worse is a current 0-7 SU/ATS losing streak to the Steelers here in the Queen City. Might be another one to stay away from.

What the struggles of double-digit favorites also means is that single-digit chalk has certainly been a pretty strong proposition! Take out that 1-9 ATS mark, and that leaves single-digit favorites at 45-32 ATS in 2008. Who are some of the stronger looking favorites in Week 7? Let's take a look.

Tennessee (-8) at Kansas City looks to be a complete mismatch. We give out a Free Play on this game on Page 3. By the way, our NFL My EDGE selections were a perfect 3-0 last week with winners on St. Louis, New Orleans and Philadelphia. San Diego is a one-point choice in Buffalo, and although the Bills may or may not be without QB Trent Edwards, this could be a shaky spot for the Lightning Bolts as it's another 1:00 ET start. Two weeks ago, they lost outright in Miami.

The surprising Miami Dolphins are a three-point choice over Baltimore at home as the Fish look to beat a bad team for the first time this season. They have beaten New England and San Diego thus far, but have lost to the likes of Houston, Arizona and the Jets. The Ravens have lost three straight following a 2-0 start.

Dallas opened as a double-digit favorite, but that number has come way down since the Tony Romo injury was announced. Luckily for the Cowboys, they will be playing a St. Louis Rams team that was winless prior to last week. These teams have combined to go 3-8 ATS this season.

In a battle for first place in the NFC North, the Chicago Bears are a three-point home favorite over Minnesota. The visitor won both games last year and the underdog has cashed 22 of the last 32 tickets overall in this classic rivalry. Chicago has

### Kansas at Oklahoma Saturday, October 18

It's always interesting to see how a College Football team performs the week following its first loss of the season. Sometimes, they will lose focus after their championship hopes have disappeared and sleepwalk through their next game. This is particularly dangerous when the team comes back as a big favorite. However, other teams come back angry with a point to prove and often bury their opponent. This week, we feel that Bob Stoops' Oklahoma Sooners will fall into the latter category.

They'll be playing a Kansas Jayhawks team that really isn't as good as their ranking this year, or last year, indicates. KU has improved exponentially under Mark Mangino (and we cashed a winning ticket on them last Sat vs. Colorado!), but that has just as much to do with a soft schedule as it does talent upgrades. Last year, they avoided BOTH Texas and Oklahoma. They were badly outclassed in their lone test, in a neutral site affair vs. Missouri, who beat the Jayhawks, 36-28, in a game that wasn't nearly that close. Their non-conference schedule was one of the weakest in the nation in 2007, something they tried to rectify this year, but once again they fell short when trying to "step up" as they lost at South Florida while allowing 37 points and 458 yards to a team that lost to Dave Wannstedt. Oklahoma is 11-3 ATS as a home favorite and averages 48 PPG in Norman this season. Kansas simply lacks the firepower to compete here. Since 2002, OU is 21-0 at home in conference play with the average win coming by 28 PPG.

### Baylor at Oklahoma State Saturday, October 18

Oklahoma State (6-0) remained undefeated by upsetting Missouri, 28-23, on the road as 13 point dogs last Saturday. They're now more than a two touchdown home favorite this Saturday hosting a Baylor squad (3-3) that's 0-3 SU & 1-2 ATS in the Dog role this season. In those three games, Baylor has allowed an average of 40.3 points per game! That's going to spell trouble for Baylor's defensive unit as Oklahoma State has scored 55 points or



more in an **INCREDIBLE** 4 of their 6 games this year. Oklahoma State has dominated this series, owning a 6-0 SU & 5-1 ATS record during the last six meetings, including a 45-14 victory in Waco last year as 14 point favorites. Lay the double digits as they should have no trouble putting up big numbers once again at home this Saturday.

#### Play on Oklahoma State

Carlo Campanella **CRUSHED** the books last Sunday with his "AFC Game of the Year," as Jacksonville upset Denver, 27-17, as 3 point Dogs! That victory improved The Iron Horse to an 8-4 (67%) Winning Run with his last 12 Guaranteed Football selections!

also gone 1-8 SU/ATS the last nine seasons before the bye week. The Monsters of the Midway look like one single-digit fave to stay away from.

In an equally important NFC South battle, Carolina (-3) hosts New Orleans. The Panthers were blown out in Tampa Bay last week, while the Saints crushed the Raiders. In other action, Houston is a nine-point favorite over winless Detroit. We give out a Free Play on that game as well on Page 3. Same for Cleveland at Washington (-7), which looks like an interesting inter-conference battle. The Jets are favored by just three in Oakland and look

like a solid play. The Raiders are a horrible 7-20 ATS L27 as home dogs of a touchdown or less. Rounding out the Sunday afternoon card is Indianapolis at Green Bay. The Colts look like they have gotten back on track and find themselves as two-point road favorites. However, Green Bay went 4-0 SU/ATS vs. the AFC last year.

So, will it be the favorites or the underdogs that reign supreme in Week Seven? We've already mentioned that underdogs have cashed more tickets than their favored counterparts each of the last two weeks, but in Weeks 1 and 3, favorites did a lot of damage going 10-6 ATS both times. One thing that you can bet on is that the

We didn't really get a chance to get into this week's College slate, which gets underway on Thursday with a pair of games. Don't forget that Missouri is at Texas on Saturday with the top-ranked Longhorns currently favored by 5.5 points. And the World Series is just around the corner with both the Phillies and the Rays each needing just a single victory to advance to the Fall Classic.

## Tennessee at Kansas City Sunday, October 19th, 1:00 ET

On paper, this looks like a complete mismatch. On the football field Sunday, it will too. Both teams come off byes. However, that is where the similarities end. This could be a pairing of the NFL's best team against its worst. The Tennessee Titans enter Week Seven at 5-0 SU/ATS, the only team unbeaten on both the field and the betting window in the entire league. Jeff Fisher's team has been an excellent proposition through the years when coming off a bye, going 7-3 SU/6-3-1 ATS in post-bye week games over the last decade.

Not only is the favorite on a 3-0 ATS run in this series, but Tennessee is also 13-3 ATS its L16 road meetings against teams with a winning percentage of .250 or less. Jeff Fisher doesn't screw around, in other words.

Kansas City is just atrocious. Sure, they beat Denver, 33-19, three weeks ago, but that was proven to be an aberration as they were clobbered by Carolina 34-0 the following week. They have now lost 13 of their last 14 games overall. They have covered the number in just one home game during that stretch. In the Panthers loss, the offense gained a pathetic 127 yards of total offense, 50 of them coming in a meaningless 4th quarter.

As good as the Panthers defense is, the Titans is much better. In fact, there is none better. They allow an NFL best 11.2 PPG. Tennessee is 13-5-1 ATS its last 19 games. Kansas City is 2-7-1 ATS its last 10 home games. A 35-year old Mushin Muhammed torched the Chiefs defense, what do you think Titans QB Kerry Collins is going to do? **3\* on Tennessee**

## Detroit at Houston Sunday, October 19th, 4:05 ET

The number of winless NFL teams was cut in half last week from four to two, but don't tell that to the Detroit Lions, who are now 0-5 on the young season and have lost 12 of their last 13 games overall dating back to last year. Lions' backers were quick to finger former GM Matt Millen as the source of the problem, but he's gone now and the Lions are 0-2 since his dismissal.

They did pick up their first ATS win of the season, however, covering a 12-point number at Minnesota last week. That gives us

some reason for optimism. So too does the fact that this week Detroit will be once again getting a generous helping of points against the Houston Texans, a team that was also winless prior to its last game. Looks like an overlay here.

We're not at all about to lay this many points with a Houston team that has just 18 SU wins at home all-time. They come off one last week, by a single point over Miami, and it needs to be stated that the Texans are just 4-14 ATS all-time coming off a home win. Looking back through franchise history, we see that only one other time have they been asked to lay this many points at the betting window. That was in the final week of the 2004 regular season and they lost outright, 22-14, to Cleveland.

As both Houston and St. Louis found out last week, you are not going to lose every game. We give the Lions an excellent shot at the outright upset this week as they allow about a touchdown less per game on the road compared to what they are giving up at home. **3\* on Detroit**

## Cleveland at Washington Sunday, October 19th, 4:15 ET

There are numerous interesting angles that have us looking at this inter-conference matchup. Thanks to some research by Vegas Expert Lenny Del Genio, we can report that double-digit favorites this NFL betting season have been an absolute disaster. Both Washington and Minnesota failed at the betting window last week laying 10 or more and now these DD chalk are just 1-9 ATS in 2008! Washington's outright loss (we had the Rams right here in the EDGE) also wasn't much of a shocker considering that DD faves have now lost

For the second straight week, the Redskins are laying double digits, this time to a Cleveland Browns team that is much better than the Rams team Washington faced last week. Cleveland really picked up a season-saving win on Monday night, crushing the Super Bowl champion Giants with ease, 35-14. *Editor's Note: Line down to 7.5, play is still good*

Remember, when playing against teams coming off the Monday Night Game was the way to go? Well, not anymore! Teams playing on the short week are now 8-4 ATS this season. Monday Night Winners are a perfect 6-0 SU and 4-2 ATS. The two ATS losses came in Week 2 in Denver's wild win over San Diego (missed cover by half a point) and last week when Minnesota could not cover an impossible double-digit spot (what else?) in Detroit.

Not sure if Cleveland can turn the same trick that St. Louis did, but the Browns are 6-1-1 ATS as road dogs under HC Crennel when getting a touchdown or more. Washington is now just 1-9 ATS against teams with losing records, something we reported last week prior to their loss to the Rams.

## North Carolina at Virginia Saturday, October 18th, 3:30 ET

Although you probably don't know it, this is actually the South's oldest rivalry and will be the 113th all-time meeting. Major improvement was expected out of Butch Davis' UNC Tar Heels coming into 2008 and so far Davis has delivered as North Carolina is off to a 5-1 start and finds itself ranked #18 in the country. This team very well could be unbeaten and in the pole position in the ACC Coastal Division race, but QB TJ Yates sprained his ankle and was lost for the season. Still, Davis has been able to circle the wagons with backup Cameron Sexton and lead his team to three straight victories. Last week, they squeaked by an improved Notre Dame team, 29-24, but did not cover the touch-down spread.

Charlottesville has been an absolute disaster for North Carolina over the last decade and beyond as they've lost 13 straight at UVA. In 2006, they were blanked 23-0 by the Cavaliers, their eighth straight ATS loss here since 1992. This is actually a double revenge spot for the Tar Heels as they lost, 22-20, in Chapel Hill last year as three-point favorites.

The Cavs have actually put together back-to-back impressive home wins over Maryland and East Carolina after a terrible 0-3 start vs. FBS competition where they were outscored 128-20. We're calling for the good times to come to an end here as this is a short number against a much better team. Remember, Virginia lost to Duke three weeks ago, 31-3, which was just the Blue Devils fourth ACC win in eight years!

Coming into this year, North Carolina had not won a game outside the Tar Heel State since 2002! However, Davis has quickly turned that around. UNC has won and covered both road games this season in impressive fashion over Rutgers and Miami. Look for them to dominate Virginia this Saturday. **3\* on North Carolina.**

## Ohio State at Michigan State Saturday, October 11th, 3:30 ET

Whatever happened to the Big Ten? It seems that every week there is a big game in both the SEC and Big 12, while nothing even remotely interesting has been going on in Big Ten country all season. Penn State has stepped up as the class of the

conference after dismantling Wisconsin, 48-7, last week on the road, but beyond that it looks like another down year for what used to be the best league in America.

That will change somewhat this week with an interesting battle in East Lansing between Ohio State and Michigan State. The Buckeyes were supposed to be Penn State this year, but injuries and an unwillingness to insert frosh phenom QB Terrelle Pryor into the starting lineup early on cost them. Still, OSU comes into this game at 6-1 and controls its own destiny in the Big Ten race. They host Penn State next week in Columbus.

First, they must take care of a surging Michigan State team though. The Spartans have been a nice surprise in this league opening conference play with three straight wins. Overall, they have won six straight following a close opening week loss at California.

However, a couple things make us very skeptical of Sparty. For starters, their three Big 10 wins came against Indiana, Iowa and Northwestern, hardly the class of the conference. Also, they are just 1-5 ATS hosting Ohio State and have lost six straight to the Buckeyes overall, including a 38-7 loss here two years ago. Also, we've seen these strong starts before from Michigan State, only for them to gag down the stretch. The carries continue to pile up for RB Javon Ringer, who eventually will run out of gas. The Spartans couldn't beat Ohio State even after being spotted two defensive touchdowns last year. Too short a number once again. **3\* on Ohio State**

## Florida Atlantic at Western Kentucky Saturday, October 18th, 1:00 ET

Here is a rare EDGE play on Saturday's Added Board. However, it's definitely one worth playing. Florida Atlantic came into

2008 expected to contend for a second straight Sun Belt Conference Title, but so far, not so good. 2008 has been a complete disaster for Howard Schnellenberger's Owls. They are just 1-5 SU and enter the weekend on a four-game losing slide. Some of the losses have been absolute heart-breakers, including a 14-13 loss to Middle Tennessee State on a last second Hail Mary. Last Tuesday, they were besieged by three turnovers and countless other mistakes in a crucial home loss to Troy.

Here, they are facing a Western Kentucky team that is arguably one of the worst in all of the FBS and is playing just its first year at this level. The Hilltoppers move to the role of favorite here is inexplicable. We know they should be fired up for their first ever meeting with FAU, a future conference rival (WKU will officially join the SBC in 2009), but they are 0-5 vs. FBS teams with the average loss coming by over 24 PPG this year.

Although, Western Kentucky is not yet an official Sun Belt member, it is worth noting that Florida Atlantic is 8-1 ATS on the SBC road. It is certainly worth noting, however, that the Owls have covered six straight against teams with losing records. They will take advantage of the drop in class, and the line move here. **3\* on Florida Atlantic.**

### Syracuse at South Florida Saturday, October 18

South Florida will be in a nasty mood this Saturday as they have had over two weeks to stew over their home loss to Pittsburgh and prepare for lowly Syracuse. The Orange are 0-5 Straight Up and 1-4 ATS in their five lined games. The Orange 4-13 ATS their last 17 October games and they are 1-8-1 ATS after scoring less than 20 points in their last game. South Florida has better players at just about every position on the field.



Look for the Bulls to score early and often as the Orange wilt in the heat of Tampa.

### UConn at Rutgers Saturday, October 18

Greg Schiano is in his eighth season at Rutgers but one has to wonder if he's taken this program as far as it's going to go and that this year's 1-5 'free-fall' is indicative of going "Back to the Future." Schiano went 3-20 (0-14 in the Big East) in his first two seasons but by 2005 he led the Scarlet Knights to the school's second-ever bowl appearance. Rutgers opened the following season 9-0 and was ranked as high as No. 3 in the nation and the team's 37-10 Texas Bowl win over Kansas State was the school's first-ever bowl victory. Rutgers was a disappointing 8-5 last year but did win its bowl game, 52-30 over Ball State (International Bowl). That's a three-year mark of 26-12 with three straight bowl appearances (two wins). Rutgers has opened the 2008 at 1-5, with its lone win coming over Morgan State. Rutgers had averaged 162, 180 and 198 YPG on the ground the last three seasons with Ray Rice in the backfield, but without him, the Scarlet Knights are averaging 113.2 YPG and just 3.6 YPC on the ground. RB Kordell Young returned last week in a loss to Cincinnati (hadn't played since gaining 94 yards vs Fresno State in the terms season-opener) but while he gained 78 yards, he only averaged 3.5 YPC (he's no Rice!). QB Mike Teel continues to be ineffective with just three TD passes and seven INTs on the year. Those numbers are even worse when one considers he's got two quality WRs. Britt caught 62 passes last year while averaging 19.9 YPC with eight TDs, but has 37 catches this year without a TD (12.5 YPC). Underwood caught 65 balls last year for seven TDs (16.9 YPC) but has only 14 catches in '08 (11.4 YPC) and also no TDs. Excluding the game with Morgan State, Rutgers' offense has averaged 13.4 PPG and its defense has zero takeaways! U Conn was off last weekend, licking its wounds after losing 38-12 at North Carolina. The Huskies had opened 5-0 and reached No. 24 in the AP poll but played poorly in Chapel Hill, allowing two non-offensive TDs (blocked punt TD and interception TD), while QB Zach Frazer threw three INTs. However, U Conn's defense did hold North Carolina to only 13 FDs while the Huskies (despite their mistakes) totaled 23 FDs and 378 yards. RB Donald Brown leads the nation in rushing (177.8 YPG / 6.0 YPC / 12 TDs) and the team averages 240.5 YPG on the ground (5.2). Frazer is in at QB for Lorenzen (broken foot) and while he played poorly in his last outing, he's replacing a guy who had a one-to-six TD-to-INT ratio of his own. U Conn owns a solid defense and the last five years has gone 3-2 SU and 4-0-1 ATS against Rutgers. U Conn is the far superior team this year and the pointspread does NOT reflect it.

#### Play on UConn

Larry's CFB struggles continued last weekend with brutal losses Friday night on Memphis (Louisville scored THREE non-offensive TDs) and then Saturday with Georgia (see that boxscore!). However, he did manage a 3-2 Week 6 in the NFL and has opened the '08 season **18-11 (62.1 percent ATS)**. Expect this 25-year vet to get things turned around in CFB and to build on his solid start in the NFL. Join him every day at the VE guaranteed picks page where you only pay **AFTER** you win.



## Matt Fargo

### North Texas at UL-Monroe Saturday, October 18

North Texas is winless on the season but there is no way it should be catching this many points against a team that is only one win better. The Mean Green have not been competitive at all this season as they are getting outscored by over 37 PPG. To their credit, the schedule has been a tough one as it is currently ranked 31st in the nation. Kansas St., Tulsa and LSU started the slate and losing big games to those teams was no surprise at all.

The Warhawks come in 1-5 on the season and while they have been more competitive, there is a good reason for it. The lone victory came against Alabama A&M so like North Texas, it has yet to defeat a FBS team. This is the first of three straight home games for UL-Monroe, but with the final two coming against Florida Atlantic and Troy, it could already be lookahead time. Obviously, the Warhawks want to come out of here victorious, but I do not see a full effort in this one.

Looking at rushing offense and defense and passing offense and defense, these two teams are not far off from each other as the average ranking of those four categories is a good indicator of where the two stack up. The North Texas average is 93rd while the UL-Monroe average is 97th so the Mean Green actually have a slight edge and this is with playing a tougher schedule. The Warhawks stop unit was supposed to be one of the better units in the league but it is currently ranked 7th in the SBC in total defense.

North Texas can take advantage of this soft defense. The team has not been able to get many points on the board, but the offense has been able to move the ball as it is 61st in the country in total offense, including 38th in passing offense. The Mean Green are 71st in rushing offense and they can improve upon that here going up against the 118th ranked rushing defense. The Warhawks allowed an unfathomable 556 yards rushing against Louisiana-Lafayette.

The UL-Monroe offense does have a playmaker in quarterback Kinsmon Lancaster as he is 49th in the nation in total offense. The problem has been converting the plays that count and that namely is on third down. The Warhawks are 118th in the country in third down conversion at a mere 24.4 percent. The North Texas defense isn't like to hold them down much, but it likely won't have to. North Texas is hoping for a shootout which is the way it can win and stay within this inflated number.

### Play on North Texas

Matt Fargo is becoming recognized as one of the best and most consistent handicappers in the world. In his 14 years of handicapping, Fargo has had winning seasons 11 times and has not had only one losing season in the past 10 campaigns.



## Big Al McMordie

### Ole Miss at Alabama Saturday, October 18

In its last game, Mississippi was favored by 2 points at home against South Carolina, but fell to the Gamecocks 31-24. Alabama also played a close game, and squeaked out a 3-point win over Kentucky, which wasn't very impressive considering the Crimson Tide were a 15.5-point favorite.



But Alabama was coming off an emotional 41-30 upset win of Georgia, so it had a natural letdown vs. Kentucky. Both teams had last week off to re-group, and I think Mississippi will give Alabama all it can handle this Saturday, as they fall into a rebound system of mine that has cashed 63% ATS. Consider that, since 1980, .333 (or better) road underdogs priced from +3.5 to +17.5 are a super 140-84 ATS vs. conference foes, if our road dog lost its previous game straight-up as a home favorite. The last three years, Alabama has defeated Ole Miss by a field goal each game, but the Rebels covered the spread as a big underdog in all three games. Look for Mississippi to get its 4th straight cover vs. Alabama. Take the points. Good luck, as always...Al McMordie.

### San Francisco at NY Giants Sunday, October 19

Both these teams have seen each of their last two games finish above the total. That has given us excellent line value this week as the over/under number is higher than the key number of 44. Not surprisingly, the defending champs are substantial favorites. That's noteworthy as we find the 'under' at 6-3 the last nine times that the Giants were



favored by 10 or more points and 9-6 the last 15 times that they faced a team with a losing record. Looking back further and we find the 'under' at a profitable 63-41-1 the Giants' last 105 times that they faced a team with a losing record, which is better than 60%. Both teams figure to run the ball frequently, which will help to keep the clock moving. The 49'ers know that they are a much better team when Frank Gore gets numerous touches. Meanwhile, the Giants have run the ball 30.2 times per game, which is the seventh most running plays in the league.

Neither defense was happy with last week's effort and both units should be fired up for this one. Note that this is an early game (1:00 ET) and that it's often difficult for teams from the West Coast to "wake up" and put points on the board when their internal body clocks are telling them that it's still only 10:00 am. Last week, the Raiders were the only West Coast team to play an early game in the Eastern Time Zone. They managed only three points. The 49'ers have played one "early" game this season and managed only 17 points. Looking back to last year and we find that they scored 17 points or less in ALL six of their games which started at 1:00 ET, averaging only 14.17 points in those games. Look for a heavy dose of the run from both teams to help chew up the clock and for the final combined score to finish below the generous number.

### Nebraska at Iowa State Saturday, October 18

I'm laying the points with the Cornhuskers on Saturday. Nebraska made the correct choice when hiring Bill Callahan's replacement this past off-season. Bo Pelini brings fire and passion to a program that has lacked both since Tom Osborne hung up his headset 10 years ago. While a series of mistakes snowballed into a blowout loss to the high-powered Missouri Tigers, Nebraska is just a couple of plays away from winning each of their other five games.

Instead, the Huskers enter Ames, Iowa with a 3-3 SU mark. But the team took a big step last week in a loss in Lubbock, Texas. The offensive line is healthy, and with new coach Barney Cotton calling the shots, the Huskers are returning to form. By the way, Cotton was on the Nebraska staff just a few years ago when Pelini coached the defense under Frank Solich. When that staff was shown the door in favor of Callahan, Cotton took the offensive line coaching job at Iowa State. But he's back in Lincoln and already making a huge improvement.

Nebraska was able to control the time of possession last weekend thanks to the new-found running game, behind their mammoth offensive line. It's a line that out-weighs Iowa State's ends by about 40-pounds per man. And, the Cyclone defense is about as undisciplined as you'll see at the major college level.

Not only has the defense been shredded, but they're out of control. First of all, they have allowed 34, 35, and 38 points in their last three games (all losses) to UNLV, Kansas, and Baylor. Those three teams have gained 1,325 yards on 205 plays, or 441.7 yards per game at 6.46 yards per play. The Cyclone defense is young, with two freshmen getting a lot of playing time in the secondary. In fact, in those last three games, ISU has allowed a 72% completion rate, 284 passing yards per game at 10.92 yards per pass, and eight touchdowns with just one interception. OUCH!

Back to the lack of discipline. Iowa State's defense loses their cool more often than they deflect a pass. I was at one of their games (at UNLV) in person and saw two ISU defensive players ejected in the first half alone. Then, they spent the rest of the game jawing with fans from the sideline. The unit reminds me somewhat of the Michigan State Spartans during the John L. Smith era. Constantly drawing stupid 15-yard frustration penalties. Their lack of focus, combined with a four-game skid will catch up with them again on Saturday. It's a demoralized football team with a coach who's already on the hot seat in just his second year. And, it has as much to do with the lack of discipline as it does with on-field performance. Nebraska rolls into Ames with a new-found confidence and a coaching staff with a plan for the first time in six seasons. Look for the Cornhuskers to roll to a rare road win. ### Arkansas State at Louisiana-Lafayette Saturday, October 18

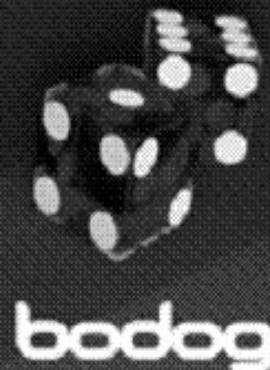
