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BCS or Just Plain BS?

We are rapidly closing in on the final weekend of October and that means the first BCS rankings are now out. To no one's surprise, the Texas Longhorns were ranked #1 after thrashing both Oklahoma and Missouri, each of whom were unbeaten just two weeks ago. Right behind Texas is the Alabama Crimson Tide, who can't seem to cover a spread when favored, and checking in at #3 is fellow unbeaten Penn State, who appears to have the path of least resistance in the march to the BCS Title Game. That is, if they get by Ohio State on Saturday night, of course.

After the three unbeaten comes a grouping of one-loss teams. Despite what everyone on TV is saying, Oklahoma is the best one-loss team in the nation as their lone blemish came on a neutral field to the team that is the consensus #1 in the country. Contrast that with everyone's darling, #5 Southern Cal, who lost to unranked Oregon State. Of course, the Trojans are in a much better position to make a run at the title game by virtue of playing in the ultra-weak Pac 10. The Sooners might already be out of it because they need Texas to lose twice.

Unbeaten Oklahoma State is only #6, but they can move themselves right up the rankings if they can beat Texas on Saturday. #7 Georgia has an important showdown with #13 LSU, on the road, this weekend. Our next unbeaten, #8 Texas Tech, will still be able to play its way into the title game as they have upcoming home dates with the Big 12 unbeaten Texas and OSU. However, first they must win at Kansas this Saturday.

The team no one wants to see get back into the National Championship picture, #9 Ohio State, can do just that with a home victory over #3 Penn State Saturday. Florida rounds

out the top ten and can play its way back into the picture with a neutral site win vs. Georgia next week. But first, the Gators must get by Kentucky this week, a task that shouldn't prove very daunting. The next two teams in the rankings, Utah and Boise State, are right where they need to be, as non-BCS conference schools must finish in the top 12 to qualify for one of the top bowl games.

Now, let's analyze. While the situation will play itself out for the most part, we could be left with yet another BCS mess when all is said and done. If #1 Texas runs the table, they should be in the title game. The likelihood of that occurring though is small. After this week's date with Oklahoma State (Longhorns are favored by 12.5), they have a road date at Texas Tech, two weeks later they are at ranked Kansas and then comes the potential Big 12 Title game, which could conceivably be against a Missouri team they just beatdown.

Has anyone thought about what would happen if we were to end up with a three or four-way tie in the Big 12 South? Because it is a possibility. That would certainly cheapen the eventual conference champion's resume and muddle the National Title picture.

What about the SEC? Alabama is clearly the front-runner with only a road date at LSU looking like an impediment to their conference title game. However, keep in mind they would also have to end a six-game losing streak to Auburn in the "Iron Bowl." Before any of this, they must win at Tennessee this weekend. Shouldn't be a problem, as the Tide are 6-1 ATS at Knoxville since 1992. Currently, the Tide are a 6.5-point choice.

We suppose the only real problem is if Texas, Alabama and Penn State were to all run the table. What are the chances of that happening? The other issue would be if just one of those teams run the table leaving a multitude of one-loss teams stak-

Wyoming at TCU Saturday, October 25

It was back on September 6th in these very pages that we proved that there can be tremendous value with taking big underdogs in College Football. We took Ohio University that day, a 34.5-point dog at Ohio State, and all the Bobcats did was very nearly upset the Buckeyes in an eventual loss 26-14 loss. It was a terrible spot for OSU that day as they had a major lookahead to USC the following week and they were never in position to cover the near five-touchdown spread.

There is a similar situation on this Saturday's CFB card in the form of Wyoming at TCU. Rather than a lookahead, Texas Christian is headed for a major letdown following last Thursday's monster 32-7 upset of previously unbeaten BYU. Now, they are being asked to lay more than 30 points to a Wyoming team that is on a 0-11 ATS run in MWC Play. Can't see the Horned Frogs getting "too up" for this one despite playing with revenge for a 24-21 loss last year. The Cowboys actually led that game by 18 in the 4th Quarter and have beaten TCU 2 of the previous 3 meetings. That means we're getting a dog that has some confidence (which they need following an awful start) plus they are coming off a bye week.

Wyoming is just plain "due" here and getting an unmotivated favorite off its biggest win of the year is just the recipe for success.

There is still a pair of winless teams as well: Detroit and Cincinnati. Maybe the Lions have a chance as they will be host-

Kansas City at NY Jets Sunday, October 26th, 1:00 ET

The Kansas City Chiefs are terrible, but not this terrible. There really isn't any team in the league that should be getting 13 points against the Jets, particularly after the Flyboys went out and inexplicably lost in Oakland last week. That was a game where the line should have told you something as the Raiders certainly didn't seem to deserve that kind of respect from the oddsmakers, and alas, they won and cashed.

This, however, is an overlay with everyone expecting a big bounce back from New York. Sure enough, the line continues to rise. Favre and company simply are not that good as their three wins came against Miami, Arizona and Cincinnati and only one of those victories (Arizona) came by a margin that would cover this number.

However, the main reason we are taking the points here is the success rate of double-digit underdogs this year in the NFL. They are now 10-2 ATS following last Sunday night's "backdoor" cover by Seattle. That's the one real positive of taking DD dogs, you can always sneak in through that backdoor. Even more promising is that DD dogs have won outright four times this year! We're not guaranteeing that result with the Chiefs this week, but they will easily stay within the number as they are 6-0 ATS L6 as DD dogs.

Herm Edwards is on the hot seat as his young team has lost 14 of 15 overall. He is desperate for a win to save his job, so expect maximum effort here. KC backers will be happy to know that underdogs of 10.5 points or more that were outgained by 100+ yards in each of their last two games and are being outgained on average of over 100 yards per game on the season are 24-4 ATS since 1983. **3* on Kansas City.**

Arizona at Carolina Sunday, October 26th, 1:00 ET

Double-digit favorites aren't the only NFL teams struggling this year. So too are West Coast teams playing on the East Coast in 1:00 starts. Not a single West Coast team has won a 1:00 ET start this year. This phenomenon actually stretches well beyond just the 2008 betting season, however, as since 2002, West Coast teams are 27-66 in these early starts. That's a win

percentage of just 29%!

Now, we'll need more than just a win from the Carolina Panthers this week as they are 4.5-point favorites over the Arizona Cardinals. Shouldn't be a problem, however. They have covered seven straight at home, the longest such streak during the tenure of HC John Fox, who is usually noted as a better play on the road. The Panthers have won all four home games this season, and by an average of 19 PPG. Their last three home games have produced a combined result of 88-16.

Making life easier is the fact that Arizona is a lousy road team, particularly out on the East Coast where both of their losses have occurred this season. They gave up 56 points to the Jets in one of those contests. The Cards have lost 14 straight away games to teams with a winning record. Overall, they have lost 58 of their last 74 road games. This is a franchise that is not known for winning, so it's not surprising that since 1992, they own an 8-21 pointspread mark when coming off back-to-back wins. These teams met last year and the result was an easy win and cover for Carolina, 27-10, at Arizona as six-point pups. **3* on Carolina.**

Cleveland at Jacksonville Sunday, October 26th, 4:05 ET

The Cleveland Browns have quickly turned into the biggest flop of the 2008 NFL Season. They are getting woefully inconsistent play from QB Derek Anderson, which will eventually lead to a change under center to second-year man Brady

Quinn. But, it's not all Anderson's fault as HC Romeo Crennel ranks amongst the worst coaches in the entire league. His clock management skills appear to be non-existent. Three coaches have already been fired this year. Could Romeo be next?

Take away the Browns' 35-point, 454-yard performance against the Giants on Monday Night Football and this once heralded offense is averaging just 12.4 PPG in its last eight contests. Anderson was simply atrocious last week at Washington, going 14 of 37 for 134 yards. He started that game 5 of 22 before a late rally earned Cleveland at least a cover and made the stats look somewhat respectable.

Usually undervalued by the oddsmakers, Cleveland has actually covered three straight games, but that's a streak that is bound to come to an end. Here is another negative on the coaching staff: the Browns offense has not scored a single touchdown in the first or third quarter this season! That means the game plan coming into the game is lousy and no second half adjustments are being made.

Jacksonville is off a bye and, like Cleveland, has also been a disappointment this season. They are 0-4 ATS as a favorite, but 2-0 ATS as an underdog. Unfortunately for them, they are the chalk this week. However, that is to be expected and with the number under a touchdown, it's more than manageable. Another streak that is due to come to an end is one that has seen the road team cash five straight in this H2H series. **3* on Jacksonville.**

Michigan State at Michigan Saturday October 25th, 3:30 ET

Are you kidding me, Michigan State? Last week, right here in the EDGE, we predicted that Ohio State would go to East Lansing and win and cover against the Spartans, but we never could have imagined it would have been such a one-sided decision. The game was over just minutes after it began as the Buckeyes raced out to a quick 21-0 1st quarter lead and never looked back. This is yet another classic example of Michigan State failing to step up in the big game. Diehard Spartans fans don't want to hear this, but we've seen this same "song and dance" from their team before. In 2006, they started 3-0 only to finish 4-8. In 2005, they started 4-0 and finished 5-6. In 2003, they started 7-1 and finished 8-5. Is another late season swoon in the works?

Not likely, despite last week's horrifying result. This week's huge rivalry game with Michigan is incredibly important to the Spartans season, but lucky for them it comes against a horrible team. And Michigan State certainly owes their in-state rivals some payback. The Wolverines have claimed the Paul Bunyan Trophy six straight years and have lost 17 of the last 20 here at "The Big House". MSU hasn't won in Ann Arbor since 1990.

The good news is that they are catching the Maize and Blue in a down year and because of last week's result, we are getting a short number. Michigan is a pathetic 1-6 ATS this season with the lone cover coming in a huge comeback win over Wisconsin where they trailed 19-0 in the second half. The better news is that Michigan State is a perfect 6-0 ATS in road games if they are coming off a home game. **3* on Michigan State.**

Georgia at LSU Saturday, October 25th, 3:30 ET

At first blush, this one looks like a tough call. The last meeting between the teams was the 2005 SEC Title Game—a 34-14 Georgia win. The Bulldogs have taken five of the previous seven meetings overall, however, they are just 1-3 L4 at Baton Rouge and that includes a 17-10 loss in their last visit (2003). The home team has won five of the last six meetings overall.

However, what we really like about this matchup is that we are getting the better

team at an underdog price, something we always look for. LSU is just 1-8 ATS at home in conference play over the last three seasons. Even worse is their 1-14 pointspread mark under HC Les Miles when laying more than two points anywhere.

The Tigers did rebound nicely from a 51-21 loss to Florida with a 24-17 win at South Carolina (thanks to some help from the refs!) last week, but we're still not sold on this team as their three SEC wins have come by a combined 22 points and that was against lesser competition than they'll face here. Georgia has been an excellent road dog under HC Mark Richt, cashing seven of nine tickets in that role. In Richt's eight-year tenure in Athens, the Bulldogs have won 27 of 31 road games overall!

The last three times UGA has been listed as an underdog, they have won outright each time. Last year, they were +7 vs. Florida in "The World's Largest Cocktail Party" and won 42-30. Several weeks earlier, they were at Alabama and won 26-23 as a three-point pup. Going back to the previous year, they won at Auburn as eleven-point dogs, 37-15. Better team wins on Saturday. **3* on Georgia.**

Penn State at Ohio State Saturday October 25th, 8:00 ET

Michigan State (see above) isn't the only Big Ten road team on this week's card where history is frowning upon them. #3 Penn State will face its toughest challenge of the year on Saturday night when they travel to Columbus to take on Ohio State, in a venue that has been an absolute disaster for them. The Nittany Lions have not won in Columbus since joining the Big Ten, going 0-7 here with the average loss coming by 21 PPG.

However, as you know by our Michigan State pick, we're not afraid to buck history when the situation calls for it. The situation calls for it here. This is the best Penn State team we've seen since the 1994 edition that went 12-0, but did not get a shot at playing for the national championship. Hopefully, if they run the table this year, they will get such an opportunity. This is a team that has won every game this season by at least two touchdowns and they only time they were favored by single digits this season; it resulted in a 48-7 win at Wisconsin.

Penn State is 0-7 ATS in Columbus since 1992 and hadn't beaten a ranked team on the road before the Wisconsin game since 2002. However, they are just as experienced on both sides of the ball as the Buckeyes (18 returning starters for both) and will face a freshman QB, Terrelle Pryor, who has been good, but hasn't faced a defense of this caliber to date. While OSU is only allowing 9.6 PPG at home this year, PSU is even better on the road, allowing just 8.7 PPG. The Nittany Lions outscore opponents on average of 45.4 to 11.7. **3* on Penn State.**

USC at Arizona Saturday, October 25

Look for Southern Cal to take no prisoners the rest of the as the way as they look to impress the BCS committee. The Trojans are 27-12 ATS after scoring more than 40 points in their last game and they are 13-4 ATS after scoring 50 or more points in their last game. USC has at least 10 future National Football League players on their current roster, some of who don't even start. The Trojans won't have to worry about this trip to Arizona as the Wildcats continue to burn money in Tucson, despite last week's 42-27 home win vs. California as they are 36-56 ATS their last 92 home games. The Wildcats are 2-7 ATS after scoring 40 or more points in their last game and they are 1-4 ATS after allowing over 280 yards passing in their last game.

Louisiana Tech at Army Saturday, October 25

Stan Brock went 3-9 in his first year at West Point and when his team lost 28-10 at home to New Hampshire on September 6, his postgame comments indicated he was at his wit's end. However, the Cadets have looked like a completely different team this past month, as Brock switched to the option full-time with his offense, four games ago. The result has been a 2-2 record and a 4-0 ATS mark. Led by FB Mooney (817 YR / 6.3 YPC), the Cadets have averaged 308 YPG on the ground



these last four games (average on the year is up to 253 YPG) and QB Chip Bowden, while hardly ever passing, has added an average of 64.5 YPG on the ground. He's attempted just 21 passes all season, not throwing a TD pass nor an interception. Army lost close contests at Texas A&M (21-17) and Buffalo (27-24 in OT), while winning at Tulane (44-13) and at home over Eastern Michigan (17-13), while not completing a single pass. The Army 'D' has been impressive all season, ranking 40th in the nation in yards allowed (325.7 YPG) and giving up a respectable 22.7 PPG. La Tech has given up on Bennett at QB (38.6 percent with two TDs and five INTs) and Ross Jenkins (13-of-20 for 192 yards) helped lead the Bulldogs to a 46-14 win over Idaho last Saturday. However, Tech has scored a total of just 17 points in three road games this year, dropping the school's road mark to 15-44 SU and 18-40-1 ATS this decade. The La Tech rush 'D' has posted some solid numbers in '08 (100.7 YPG / 3.2 YPC) but it hasn't faced the Army option. This is the first-ever meeting between the two schools and I expect Army's current ATS winning streak to stay intact.

Larry bounced back with an excellent CFB weekend (Oct 16-18), going **5-1** will all his releases, including a 45-7 win with Ohio State as his Big 10 GOY. He stumbled in the NFL going 2-3 but he's still a solid **58.8 percent ATS** on all his NFL premium plays in '08. Larry did win his NFL Insider in Week 7 on the Bills and is now **5-1 (83.3 percent)** with his NFL Las Vegas Insiders this year plus won with the Pats (41-7) on Monday, upping his Monday night record to **6-2 (75 percent ATS)** in FB '08. Cincinnati at Connecticut Saturday, October 25

Cincinnati is coming off a bye week and that extra time will be beneficial. The Bearcats have won four straight games and are currently 1-0 in the Big East Conference. This game means quite a bit considering the next four games come against the best four teams in the conference, so heading into that stretch at 2-0 is a must. Making things even more interesting is the fact that Cincinnati will have only five days after this one to get ready for a visit from the Bulls.

While the Bearcats are hot, Connecticut is struggling. The Huskies have dropped two straight games including a heartbreaker at Rutgers over the weekend. They had a shot to win but missed a field goal with just over a minute remaining. This will be the first home game in five weeks for the Huskies, which is no doubt a big advantage, while they are also playing with revenge following a 27-3 blowout loss last season in Cincinnati. However, the Bearcats have too many edges in this one.

Three games back, the Huskies won at Louisville in a game they had no business winning and it was the one game they were outrushed this season. Connecticut rushed for only 157 yards that night and that has begun a downward spiral. After averaging 279.5 ypg in their first four games, the Huskies have averaged only 147.3 ypg over their last three games. Things won't get better here as Cincinnati comes into this game with the 13th ranked rushing defense in the nation, allowing just 94.5 ypg.

Special teams, defense, and a resurgent running game have helped the Bearcats play through the loss of their top two quarterbacks to injury. Despite this, the Bearcats are 39th in the country in total offense, including 26th in passing offense and 21st in passing efficiency. They will go against a solid defense in Connecticut, but after allowing 7.3 ppg in their first three games, the Huskies have allowed 24.8 ppg in their last four games and it is no surprise due to the level of competition increasing.

Field position can play a big role and Cincinnati has a huge edge in two big special teams' categories. It is 1st in the country in net punting while the Huskies are only 84th and the Bearcats are 6th in kickoff returns while Connecticut is 99th. Cincinnati has covered 10 of its last 14 games against teams with a winning record while the Huskies are only 1-6 ATS in their last seven against winning teams. That shows a lot of how each steps up or down against the level of competition and we will see more of the same here.

Philadelphia at Tampa Bay (MLB) Wednesday, October 22

At 8:20pm, our selection is on the Tampa Bay Rays and Philadelphia Phillies 'over' the total. The first game of this World Series will feature a lefty vs. lefty matchup of young starters Cole Hamels vs. Scott Kazmir. After a lackluster NL Division Series that saw them score only 15 runs in four games, the Phillies' hitters turned it up a notch in the NLCS, and sent 22 men across the plate in the final four games against the Dodgers. And now they will get the added benefit of a DH for the first two games in this World Series against Tampa, so that should help them increase their run output perhaps beyond where they left off in Los Angeles. Philadelphia, which hit better as a team vs. lefties than righties, hasn't seen a southpaw starter since Game Two of the NL Division Series against the the Brewers and CC Sabathia, and they scored five runs in that game without the help of a designated hitter. For Tampa's part, the adrenaline will be flowing following its huge win on Sunday against the Red Sox, so look for the Rays to come out firing as well. Hamels has not faced the Rays since his rookie season in 2006 when he had one start against them and that was definitely not one of his better moments. The Rays are hoping he has some flashbacks tonight in Game 1. Take the 'over'. As always, good luck...Al McMordie.

Kansas City at NY Jets Sunday, October 26

The Chiefs gave up 34 points to the Titans last week and have seen three of four games finish above the total. Those results have helped keep Sunday afternoon's over/under line above the key number of 37. I believe that provides us with plenty of value. The Chiefs have seen the 'under' go 12-7-1 their last 20 road games. They've also seen the under go 4-1 the last five times that they were double-digit underdogs. They've scored just 10 points in their last two games combined. As for the Jets, they managed only 13 at Oakland last week. Including that result, they've seen the 'under' go 10-3 their last 13 games. Looking back further and we find the 'under' at a profitable 61-40-2 the last 103 times that they were laying points, including 2-0 when they were listed as double-digit favorites. Last year's meeting finished with a score of 13-10 and this year's has all the makings of another low-scoring affair. Consider the Under.

Play Kansas City/NY Jets UNDER

Don't look now but Ben Burns is on another MAJOR RUN. He's **4-1 his last 5 NFL picks** and **7-3 his L10**. His college has been winning all year (again!) and is well above **60%** for the season. He was **5-2** with his college picks last week and is **10-3 his L13 football picks** overall. Baylor at Nebraska Saturday, October 25

Nebraska held the Cyclones to a single touchdown. They outgained the Cyclones by the whopping margin of 548 to 218. And, Bo Pelini's squad finished with 29 first downs, while holding Iowa State to 11. The result was Nebraska's first road victory after dropping five straight going back to last season.

This week, Nebraska must stay focused with an improving and dangerous Baylor squad coming to town. One thing that will keep the Huskers from being "satisfied" with last week's win will be the dual threat at QB for Baylor in freshman Robert Griffin. As good as this kid may turn out to be, he has suffered some growing pains in this, his first season. Griffin and the Baylor offense were completely shut down by an Oklahoma State defense that had been allowing 23 points per game. When stepping up in competition, Griffin has been held in check. In fact, Baylor lost to Wake Forest, Oklahoma, and Oklahoma State, by a combined score of 124 to 36! No, Nebraska is not in Oklahoma or Oklahoma State's "league" right now. But they do offer a big step up from Iowa State, Washington State, and Northwestern State, which are the games that Griffin piled up his stats in. South Florida at Louisville Saturday, October 25

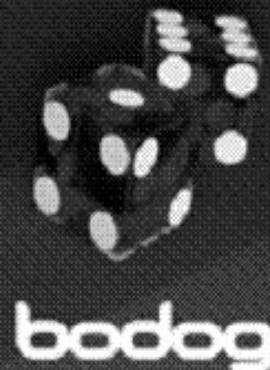
