Future Wagering

Do you know you will win the Super Bowl?

If you have an idea now is the time to make your futures wagers. For you novice sports bettors, future wagering is predicting the outcome of how certain teams will do for the upcoming season. Bodoglife.com has a number of future lines available in both NFL and College Football. Some of the more popular wagering opportunities in the NFL are team win totals, winner of the Super Bowl and AFC and NFC Championships. In college football, a ton of wagering is placed on who will win the BCS Championship and the major college teams win totals.

In looking at the NFC Championship futures you find the Dallas Cowboys as the 9/5 favorite. Seems like a bit of an overlay. The defending Super Bowl Champion Giants aren't getting much respect as they are the second choice at 7/1, tied with both New Orleans and somewhat surprisingly the Minnesota Vikings. Next comes Seattle at 9/1 as they have a decent shot playing in the weak NFC West Division. Of course the long shot is Atlanta at a healthy 75/1 odds.

Bodoglife.com has the Patriots as the favorite in the AFC at 2/1 odds. As long as Tom Brady is healthy, the Pats are always going to be the team to beat. The second choice in the AFC is not the Colts, but the Chargers at 4/1. Peyton Manning and the Colts are not getting a lot of respect at 9/2. It might not be a bad idea to throw down a few bucks on Indy and get nearly five times back your money if they get to the Super Bowl. The long shot in the AFC are Parcell's Dolphins at 60/1 odds.

Based on the Conference Championship odds, you could figure that the Patriots are the favorites to win the Super Bowl. New England is a 7/2 choice with Dallas the second choice at 6/1 odds. Once again the defending Super Bowl Champion Giants getting no respect at 20/1 odds. Hey New Yorkers, a \$500 wager on your Giants returns \$10,000 if the GMen defend their title!

The most actively bet future wagering in the NFL is the over /under win totals. Bodoglife.com has totals on all 32 NFL teams. If you want a little help making your NFL future wagers, check the Vegas Experts website where all of the handicappers have provided their top NFL future picks.

In College Football you can check to see the total win number for your favorite team. In the preseason college football polls the Georgia Bulldogs are the number one team in the country. Bodoglife.com has a 9.5 win total posted for the Bulldogs. Can Georgia win the National Title without winning at least 10 games? Don't think so, but getting through their tough SEC conference schedule will not be easy.

Second in the pools is the Ohio State Buckeyes. Can the Bucks finally win the National Title after two BCS Championship losses? Bodog.life has the Buckeyes win total at 10 with a key game at USC in week three. Speaking of Southern Cal, they have the highest win total of the major college teams (tied with Oklahoma) with a projected 10.5 win total. One play worth taking a look at is Nebraska's seven win total. The Cornhuskers have a new coach in the highly regarded Bo Pilini and a favorable schedule with their first five games at home and only three road games. Look for Bo to restore the Big Red tradition in Lincoln and win at least seven games.

Remember, College Football kicks off next weekend so now is the time to make your future wagers. Don't get shutout!

LA Dodgers at Philadelphia (MLB) Friday, August 22

It looks like the opener of this 4-game set will feature rookie southpaw Clayton Kershaw for the visitors vs. Kyle Kendrick, a second year right-hander, for the home team. If recent performance counts for anything, and I believe that it does, that matchup should favor the Dodgers. Over his last five starts, a span of 31 innings, Kershaw has allowed just five earned runs. That's a 1.45 ERA. On the other hand, Kendrick has allowed 13 earned runs in his last two starts, lasting just seven combined innings over the two games. Three of his last six starts have seen him give up six or more runs, while lasting less than five innings. Despite the fact that Kershaw comes in as the much hotter pitcher, we'll be getting a great price on the Dodgers, due to the game being played at Philadelphia. The Dodgers just swept a 4-game series against the Phillies at LA. They've also won six of their last eight here at Philadelphia.

Baltimore at St. Louis Friday, August 22

Baltimore is 1-1 at this point of the preseason; however, their offense remains unimpressive, scoring 15 and 16 points in their first two efforts. The head to St. Louis this Friday following a 23-15 home loss to the Vikings, however, we



find these Ravens at 6-1 ATS as Dogs after losing their previous game as favorites during preseason play. Add that to the fact that we're expecting the offense to finally improve for this third game as rookie QB Joe Flacco completed 10 of 15 passes last week and is continuing to learn the system along with former Ohio State star QB Troy Smith, who was 3 for 5 passing. Slight offensive improvement is all that's needed for Baltimore to win this game against a St. Louis squad that only put up 7 points against the Chargers. With St. Louis using a 4 man quarterback rotation that includes starter Bulger, who's coming off an injury to his arm, the newly acquired Trent Green, former Toledo University QB Gradkowski and Brock Berlin, we're looking towards a low scoring affair won by a sharp Ravens defense.

Philadelphia at New England Friday, August 22nd, 7:30 ET

The New England Patriots better hope and pray that the Tom Brady injury is no big deal because their backups are dreadful with a capital D. QBs Cassel, Gutierrez and rookie Kevin O'Connell are all battling for the No. 2 QB job and none look even remotely worthy. The three combined to complete 17 of 33 passes for 144 yards with three interceptions in the opener. Last week, the offense had just 56 yards rushing as no defense should respect the pass when any one of these "Three Stooges" are under center.

Philadelphia has moved the ball consistently with the first team in there, but just hasn't been able to put the ball in the end zone. McNabb led the team to 10 points on two drives in Week One vs. the Steelers and last week moved the team deep into Carolina territory a couple of times before the turnover bug bit them.

Kevin Kolb showed that he is probably the future of the team at QB as he helped engineer the late rally by going 14 of 27 for 155 yards and the game winning score.

Keep in mind that the Eagles played in very sloppy conditions last week, which contributed to some poor play. Philly might also be motivated by the fact that the Pats beat them not only last year, but in the Super Bowl a few years ago as well. The fact that we are actually getting points here is a blessing that we simply cannot pass up. **3* on Philadelphia**

That was the second straight week the Panthers offense did nothing. They may only be -8 in point differential thus far in the preseason, but they were outgained 386-212 by the Eagles despite the fact that Jake Delhomme actually appears to have gotten over a serious elbow injury and he and the first teamers were in there for the majority of the first half even with a weather delay.

Washington, meanwhile, has been one of the more impressive teams this preseason. They already have plenty of game experience under their belts, having played in the Hall of Fame Game, and they are 3-0 (2-1 ATS). They've been extremely well balanced on offense and as many as three quarterbacks have looked good during the games.

Carolina used to be a great preseason play under John Fox (we mentioned this last week), but that's really no longer the case. In fact, they are just 2-5 ATS their last 7 as a favorite, including 1-4 vs. the number at home. With Clinton Portis expected to finally see a decent amount of action for the first time here, we like the Redskins to continue their strong play. **3* on Washington**

Baltimore at St. Louis Saturday, August 23rd, 8:00 ET

This game could set football back to the dark ages. Rams starters have not scored an offensive preseason touchdown in three years under Scott Linehan! Are you kidding me? Last week, Norv Turner basically came out ahead of time and told ev-

eryone that his Chargers wouldn't exactly be approaching their game in St. Louis as if it were a playoff-like atmosphere and the Rams still could not cover. Only three San Diego offensive regulars actually played!

Week Three is known as dress rehearsal for most teams, but considering the offensive personnel of these two teams, that doesn't mean much. John Harbaugh has been running a physical camp in Baltimore, which is probably taking a lot out of his team. Take note that the Ravens are 17-7 Under their last 24 road games in preseason play to begin with. According to Harbaugh, no one has emerged as a true leader in the QB race. That's because this race is comprised of three turtles - Kyle Boller, Troy Smith and Joe Flacco. The QBs will be operating behind a makeshift offensive line and will be without running back Willis McGahee, who had arthroscopic surgery on his left knee last week.

The big news in St. Louis continues to be the continued holdout of RB Steven Jackson. Without him, this offense is atrocious. The team has been outscored 40-20 in the first two weeks. New offensive coordinator Al Saunders has clearly walked into a tough situation.

This is a very manageable number considering how bad the two offenses are. Considering that Baltimore is also 13-4 Under when coming off an Over in the preseason, we have every reason to believe that this one will foretell a dubious story for these two teams in the regular season. **3* on UNDER Baltimore/St. Louis**

Beckett has been shaky in his career against Toronto as well going 3-5 with a 5.95 ERA in 10 career starts versus the Blue Jays. Beckett has been even worse against the Blue Jays this season as he is 0-2 with a 16.71 in two starts. Beckett has given up 13 earned runs in just seven innings pitched in those starts. Jesse Litsch toes the rubber for the Blue Jays in today's game. Litsch is 0-2 with a 5.65 ERA in his last three starts overall. Litsch has a 4.57 ERA and 1.51 WHIP in four career starts versus the Red Sox. Look for both offenses to light up the scoreboard in this one as it sails well over the total.

Arizona at Oakland Saturday, August 23

With a young QB and little depth at WR, it would make sense for the Oakland Raiders to abandon their reputation as a franchise that lives to throw the deep ball and launch a run-oriented attack. Thankfully, Head Coach Lane Kiffin has won the debate over the archaic Al Davis. Through the first two weeks of the preseason campaign, no team is running the ball as well as the Silver and Black as they've handed it off to the backs 78 times for 472 yards. More importantly for Raiders backers is that the team has covered both games.

Don't laugh at our assertion that Oakland may have the best RB depth in the league. Obviously, a lot of the focus falls on #4 overall DC Darren McFadden. In his first true test of the preseason, McFadden ran the ball six times for 44 yards, including one 26-yard run right before the half that set up a 56-yard FG. Michael Bush, another heavily touted player once upon a time in the NCAA, is also drawing rave reviews. He ran the ball 14 times for 59 yards against the Titans and looks to be the favorite for goal line and short-yardage situations. And let's not forget last year's incumbent, Justin Fargas, who is coming off a 1,000 yard season in 2007!

Even JaMarcus Russell can give himself a pat on the back as he threw a TD pass last week.

Arizona, meanwhile, is at the opposite end of the rushing spectrum. They have run the ball just 36 times total (one less attempt than the Raiders total last week!) for 139 yards. With Ken Whisenhunt making recent remarks that "some people blow [the 3rd week of the preseason] out of proportion", we'll gladly lay the points with Oakland.

The offense was solid all around as Chad Pennington looked great in his debut, going 5-6 while rushing for 18 yards. Ricky Williams had a touchdown and a 4.3 ypc average while Ted Ginn Jr. had 58 yards receiving.

The Chiefs were not so fortunate this past weekend against the Cardinals as they lost by 10 points despite outgaining Arizona by 130 total yards. This is normally a possible take sign but there are some bad things that cannot be overlooked including mistakes that will be hard to turn around in just one week. The Chiefs didn't score a touchdown Saturday until 15 seconds remained in the game and the offense and the defense both seem to be behind as this team is young and a lot still needs to be learned.

The Chiefs are a team that does not take winning too seriously in the preseason and that is proven by their recent performances. Over the last four-plus exhibition seasons, they are 4-14 straight up including a 1-8 mark on the road. That 1-8 record is both straight up and against the number. The lone win was this season at Chicago but Kansas City was outgained there while allowing 175 yards rushing. 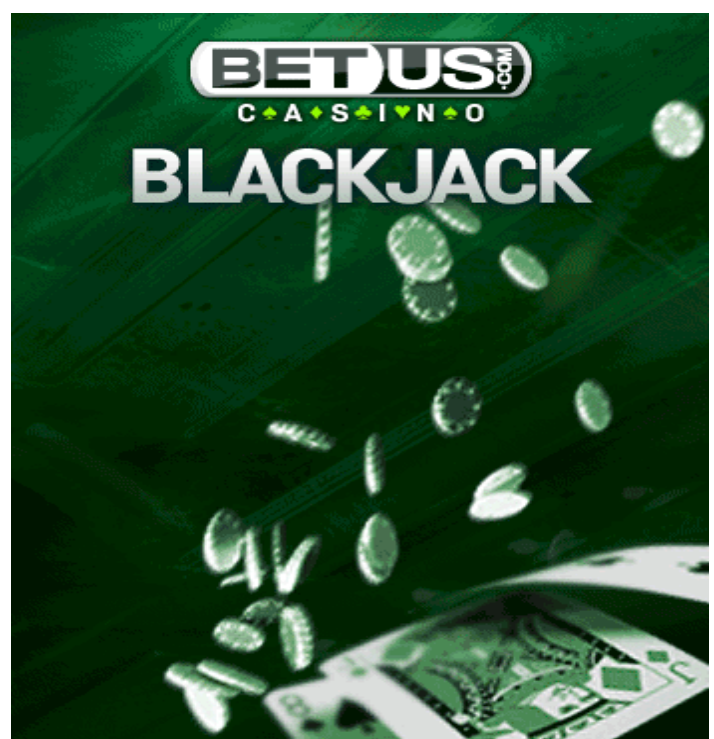
Colorado at LA Dodgers (MLB) Wednesday, August 20

I don't want to make too much of Chad Pennington's debut with the Jets. He did lead Miami to a 10-0 lead while he was in the game but Miami's TD drive was due mostly to Ricky Williams' running and the FG drive began with good field position and stalled. As for the Chiefs, they lost at home last week to the Cardinals but the 27-17 final was misleading. The KC defense played well, despite facing Warner and Leinart, who are both looking to nail down the starting job at QB. Arizona had just 215 total yards in the game (13 FDs), while KC gained 345. KC's first drive of the game got inside the Arizona 20 but the Chiefs settled for a FG and in the second quarter, KC had a first-and-goal at the Arizona six, only to settle for another FG and a 6-6 tie at the half. After Arizona opened the second half with a TD to go up 13-6, KC again drove inside the Arizona 20, again settling for a FG. Trailing 13-9, KC allowed Arizona's JJ Arrington to return the following kick-off 78 yards and one play later, the Cards went up 20-9 and "were on their way." Look for a much better effort from KC here and remember the Dolphins only had 134 yards and 10 FDs in their Week 1 game at home versus the Bucs. Take any points available, here.

Washington at Carolina Saturday, August 23

New Head Coach Jim Zorn likes to keep defenses off balance with his play calling. In three games the offense has tallied 355 yards (156 rushing), 341 yards (155 rushing) and 359 yards (181 rushing), winning all three games. However, the Redskins have had offensive line troubles and a lot of injuries. In Saturday's win over the Jets, running back Ladell Betts didn't play much because of an injury while RB Clinton Portis was given the night off.

The bulk of the yards were racked-up by RBs Rock Cartwright and Marcus Mason. I can hear the collective echo of..."Who?" Cartwright is a 7-year veteran, so it's unlikely the Redskins found a gem of a back that everyone else has missed the previous six years. The point is, I like what Zorn is doing with his offense, but don't expect this offense to be as potent in the regular season, or in this week's "dress-rehearsal" especially on the ground. After all, Washington was 20th and 15th in total offense the last two seasons under Al Saunders, a guy with an excellent reputation for running potent offenses.

This week, I believe the Skins' offense will be exposed a bit. After all, although I like Jim Zorn and feel he has Washington's offense headed in the right direction; I think they're going to show their true colors against a Panther defense that will have their regulars on the field for much of this game, according to HC John Fox.

The Skins are getting better, but are not nearly as strong as their current preseason numbers would indicate. In fact, much of their yardage has come with backups on the field, both for the Skins offense and their opponents' defenses. It's hard to imagine Colt Brennan and Rock Cartwright tearing up a first string NFL stop unit.

At the same time, the Carolina Panthers have nothing as far as experience is concerned after Jake Delhomme takes a seat. And, Delhomme still doesn't have an established "second-option" at wide-out. The offense also must deal with new faces along the offensive line. With the regulars getting their first "real" action of the preseason, I believe mistakes will be made and drives will come to screeching halts.

The total opened as high as 37. Even though it's dropped 1 1/2 points across the board at the time of this writing, I still don't feel it's come down enough. Look for a low-scoring, offensively ugly contest. I'm playing the Under between the Redskins and Panthers on Saturday night.

As we noted in last week's Edge write-up, the Colts suffered a loss in the Hall of Fame Game on Sunday, August 3rd. However, we expected that to give them an edge heading into the rest of the preseason and so far this has certainly been the case! We used the Colts right here in our Edge write-up in the "true" Week 1 of the Preseason and, although they lost in overtime to the Panthers, the Colts did get the cover in their "second" Week 1 game at Carolina on Saturday the 9th. Then, on Saturday the 16th we used Indianapolis for our Week 2 edge write-up and they once again got the job done for us as they won outright on the road at Atlanta where they knocked the Falcons off by a full touchdown. With the Colts having an extra week this preseason, by virtue of playing in the Hall of Fame Game, they did not play their personnel versus the Redskins the way we felt they would against the Panthers in Week 1 and as expected that opened things up last week against the Falcons for some additional playing time for key players. This will continue into Week 3 of the Preseason this week because Week 4 is basically a "catch all" game where all the starters sit out and it's all the reserves get all the playing time.

With this being Indy's first preseason home game, and the only game at home where the starters are likely to see any action, we look for a superb effort from the Colts. They've only failed to cover one of their three preseason games so far. They outgained Washington by 55 yards and they also had 24 first downs compared to just 20 for the Redskins. So, how did they lose by two touchdowns despite these solid numbers? It had a lot do with an interception run back for a touchdown late in the game. That was the key turnover in the game. However, it was also simply a case of "laying down" a bit too early. Up 16-9 in the third quarter and seemingly "in control" of at least the "spread victory" (Indianapolis was +4.5 in most shops), the Colts somehow saw things quickly become unraveled. Even though this was "just" a Preseason game it was still the type of effort that has given Coach Dungy's troops extra motivation for the rest of the "meaningful" preseason. That is why the Colts have covered each of the last two weeks and with the last of the "meaningful" preseason games this week, when the starters will see action; we look for a huge effort from Indianapolis at home!

The Giants have solved many of their starting and back-up roles during the last game and based on published reports in NYC newspapers their focus will be squarely on special teams.



Ai Simulator shows a 72% probability that the Jets will win this game by 4 or more points. Supporting this graded play is a system that has gone 23-7 ATS for 77% since 1998. Play on any team after scoring 14 points or less last game and is now facing an opponent after scoring 30 points or more last game. Jets are also projected to have an 84% probability of gaining 8 yards per pass attempt. The Jets are a remarkable 13-2 ATS (+10.8 Units) when they gain 8 or more net passing yards/attempt since 1993. Again, certain weeks of the pre-season correspond to a lesser focus on execution than others and the Giants display this phenomenon. They are just 3-12 ATS (-10.2 Units) in week three of the pre-season since 1993. Just obvious have a lot of work to do and they are a strong 12-3 ATS (+8.7 Units) in week three of the pre-season since 1993.

Of note: The Giants will be focusing their offensive scheme around back-up QB Anthony Wright. He had a rough outing and it is obvious that he Giants need him and that back-up unit to get more game quality snaps in this game against the Jets. Based on the matchups, the Jets will be able to contain this offensive unit. For example, Wright made several poor reads and you can't correct those in a week worth of practice. Plus, it is a short week for the Giants.
