Winds of Change

Heading into the 2008 NFL Betting Season, four AFC teams were believed to be head and shoulders above the rest of the conference: New England, San Diego, Indianapolis and Jacksonville. Well, three of those teams (Chargers, Colts and Jags) lost outright in Week One, while the lone team out of the quartet that actually won, the Patriots, may wind up being the ultimate loser in 2008 as reigning MVP Tom Brady was lost for the entire season with a knee injury. That leaves Matt Cassel, who has not started a game since high school, to lead the defending AFC Champs. One would have to surmise that Cassel will have to produce a 9-6 record down the stretch for New England to make the playoffs. Not sure if that is possible.

The team that likely benefits most from the Brady injury is the New York Jets. The Brett Favre era got off to a nice start on Sunday via a 20-14 win over the Dolphins as three-point road favorites. While a win over a 1-15 team may not look all that impressive on paper, consider that road chalk went just 4-3 SU/ATS overall in opening week play with Cincinnati and Detroit joining Jacksonville as visitors that also lost outright. Denver, Arizona and Dallas joined the Jets as road teams that got the job done when laying points.

We know it's only one week, but Dallas was certainly the one Super Bowl contender that reaffirmed its status, going into Cleveland (an alleged AFC Playoff contender) and laying a 28-10 beatdown on the Browns. Of course, Romo and the Cowboys won't be judged until playoff time, but you had to like what you saw last Sunday. Dallas hosts division rival Philadelphia in this week's Monday nighter.

In the wide open NFC, two other teams stepped up and showed that they are ready

to be considered as championship contenders. One is the Eagles, a big 38-3 winner over the lowly Rams. Remember that Andy Reid has never missed the playoffs in back-to-back seasons during his tenure in the City of Brotherly Love. The other is the Carolina Panthers, a surprising 26-24 winner in San Diego. With that win, take note that Jake Delhomme is an incredible 23-5 ATS when getting the points!

Taking big underdogs in Week 1 NFL Play seems to be the way to go. Three teams were getting nine or more from the oddsmaker last Sunday and all covered. Two won outright with Chicago joining Carolina. Kansas City also had no difficulty covering the biggest opening week number (+16.5) in New England, very nearly upsetting the Pats in an eventual 17-10 loss.

Earlier, we called Cleveland an "alleged" playoff contender. Following a 0-4 SU/ATS preseason and an embarrassing home loss to Dallas to open the season, things are starting to get bleak for the Browns. Last year, they opened with a 34-0 loss to Pittsburgh, but were able to turn to an "ace in the hole" in Derek Anderson. Unfortunately, it was Anderson at the helm on Sunday. Might we be seeing second-year man Brady Quinn a lot sooner than later? It's pretty early to start dubbing games "must-win," but it's hard to imagine the Browns absorbing another loss to the Steelers this Sunday Night and then going on to have a successful 2008 campaign. Pittsburgh looked great in their home opener, annihilating Houston 38-17, in a game that wasn't even that close.

The "winds of change" might also be blowing in the NFC West as well as multi-time defending division champ Seattle is in trouble due to a boatload of injuries. No one was surprised that they lost in Buffalo, but the margin of defeat has to raise some eyebrows. Meanwhile the only thing less common than the wind in the Arizona desert is playoff appearances, but this looks like it could be the

Michigan at Notre Dame Saturday, September 13

Two of the most storied programs in College Football history, Michigan and Notre Dame rank #1 and #2 respectively in all-time Division I victories. The teams first met in 1887 (Wolverines won 8-0) and quite frankly the 2008 edition might set college football back to that era. The Maize and Blue have dominated the series as of late, outscoring the Irish 85-21 the last two years, including a 38-0 win that matched 2002's victory as the most lopsided in series history.

The line for this game is doing some funny things with Michigan opening up as the favorite, but the line is dropping and the Wolverines could be the underdog by game time. After watching both of these teams play this season, one thing is clear: We don't want to lay points with either! Michigan has opened the season by losing outright at home to Utah and then following that up with an unimpressive 16-6 win over Miami (OH). Notre Dame opened its year last week with a 21-13 win over San Diego State, a team that lost to FCS Cal Poly SLO in its opener.

Take note that prior to last year's win and cover by Michigan, we saw the underdog win outright in every meeting from 2002-04 in this series. Therefore, with the line such a question mark, we are going to look at the total. Only one way to go here and that is Under. Rich Rodriguez does not have the personnel he needs to run his offense in Ann Arbor and Notre Dame's offense was a joke against SDSU. Five of the last six series meetings have actually gone Over here, so with the state of both programs being what it is, it's time for Under players to cash a winning ticket. Michigan is 8-2 Under in September games over the last three seasons.

Speaking of the Bills, it looks as if they should be taken seriously as a playoff contender. Granted, it was a long trip for Seattle, who is not a good road team to begin with, but Buffalo, like the Jets, can certainly take advantage of the Brady injury and parlay that into a playoff berth. Houston, like Buffalo, was a "sexy" sleeper pick in the AFC, but the Texans clearly did not wake up in time for the Steelers, a game that was over almost right after it began. Tennessee, a playoff team from last year

that no one thinks will be one this year, opened this year the same way they did last, with an upset win over Jacksonville. We're not sure if the potential loss of QB Vince Young for a month is a blessing or a curse.

The only division we have yet to really mention is the NFC North. Chicago surprised us, yes, but this race is likely to come down to Green Bay vs. Minnesota. It was nice to see QB Aaron Rodgers shut up the detractors for one night with an incredibly efficient 18 of 22 performance Monday night, giving his team a leg up in what will be a season long battle with the Vikings.

Pittsburgh at Cleveland

Sunday, September 14th, 8:00 ET

The Steelers had little trouble in their home opener as they smashed Houston 38-17, easily covering the 6-point number. Pittsburgh loves to run the football and they had big time success doing so against the Texans, rushing for 183 yards on 39 carries. With the ground game working, Big Ben was able to throw to open receivers completing 13 of 18 passes for 122 yards. On defense, the Steelers stopped the Texans running game as they allowed only 75 yards on 20 tries.

The Browns had lofty expectations for the 2008 season but laid an egg in their opener as they were completely dominated by Dallas, losing 28-10. It should have been much worse. The Cowboys bashed the Browns for 487 total yards. Isn't Romeo Crennell supposed to be a defensive genius? Not only did the Browns defense fail to show up, their high powered offense sputtered throughout the game. Derek Anderson was able to complete only 11 passes for 114 yards and the Browns could only muster 91 yards rushing. That adds up to only 205 total yards, not nearly enough to compete with the high powered Cowboys.

The Browns haven't defeated the Steelers since the 2003 season. Can they find a way to get their offense going and finally defeat their arch rivals? The Sportsbooks don't think so as they have Pittsburgh as 6-point road favorites. The Browns had an awful preseason due to injuries, and weren't ready to play the Cowboys. Romeo's teams have always played poorly in the opener. Cleveland has more players healthy this week, and they'll play much better after getting drilled last Sunday. We like Cleveland plus the points! **3* Play on Cleveland**

Moorman threw a TD pass to Ryan Denney. That play sealed the game for the Bills, taking a 27-10 lead in the third quarter. The special teams also contributed another touchdown earlier in the game when Roscoe Parrish returned a punt 63 yards for a touchdown.

The big key for the Bills was their defense as they limited Seattle quarterback Matt Hasselbeck to complete only 17 of 41 passing attempts for 190 yards and one interception. The Bills also recovered one Seahawk fumble.

Meanwhile, the Jags weren't so fortunate in their opener as they went to Tennessee and were defeated by the Titans, 17-10, failing as 3-point road favorites. The Jags left their running game in Jacksonville as they were able to rush for only 33 yards on 17 carries. You're not going to win many football games with a 2-yard per rush average. It also didn't help matters with David Garrard tossing two interceptions and the Jags losing a fumble.

The Sportsbooks have Jacksonville as 5.5-point home favorites. Jacksonville destroyed the Bills 36-14 here last year. Expect more of the same this time. We like going with the Jags coming off an upset loss and against the Bills off a nice win. Jags beat up the Bills! **3* Play on Jacksonville**

Oakland at Kansas City

Sunday, September 14th, 1:00 ET

How bad are the Raiders? Pretty bad! The NFL is rethinking the idea of having two Monday Night games in the first week of

the season, after the Raiders were destroyed by Denver 41-14. The Sportsbooks were way off in that game as Oakland was only a 3-point underdog.

The Raiders defense couldn't stop Cutler and the Broncos offense as they ran out to a 27-0 lead. Cutler completed 16 of 24 passes for 299 yards. Oakland also allowed 142 yards rushing. In the third quarter, Denver called off the dogs or it could have been worse.

Kansas City was the beneficiary of the Pats losing Tom Brady and was able to stay with New England, only losing 17-10. If the Chiefs had a little more offense they might have been able to upset the Pats, but they still have quarterback issues. Kansas City played both Huard and Croyle (injured), with both having so-so results. Larry Johnson seems to be healthy as he rushed the ball 22 times, but for only 74 yards.

Oakland and Kansas City played two close games last season. In their first meeting the Chiefs went into Oakland and defeated the Raiders 12-10 as two point dogs. In the rematch the Raiders prevailed as they upset the Chiefs in Kansas City 20-17 as four point dogs.

The Sportsbooks have the Chiefs as 3.5-point home favorites. The Raiders can't possibly play as bad as they did last Monday Night, can they? We don't think so and we look for the same type of close game that these two teams played last season. Oakland bounces back and beats up KC! **3* Play on Oakland**

Rice at Vanderbilt

Saturday, September 13th, 7:00 ET

Two undefeated teams square off Saturday afternoon in Nashville as the Owls take on the Commodores. The Sportsbooks look for Vandy to continue their undefeated mark as they are touchdown favorites. However, the opening number had Vanderbilt as a whopping 8.5-point choice.

Rice opened with a convincing 56-27 home win over SMU, easily covering as four point favorites. Then last week, the Owls went on the road and upset Memphis 42-35 as 2.5-point underdogs. Rice used an aggressive running game against SMU recording 208 yards on 44 carries. Last week, they went through the air passing for 318 yards. They're averaging 49 points per contest, a tough average to keep intact.

Vandy wasn't expected to have a very good season this year. They opened as underdogs to Miami Ohio. An SEC team getting points from a MAC team! Vandy lined up as 3-point dogs in that game and it wasn't much of a contest as they destroyed the Red Hawks 34-13. This margin wasn't reflective in the stats as they outgained Miami by only 10 total yards. The key was three critical Miami turnovers. Last week, Vandy was featured on Thursday night ESPN against the Old Ball Coach Spurrier and his South Carolina Gamecocks. Once again, no respect as the Commodores lined up as 7-point home dogs. Despite being out gained by 100 total yards, Vandy upset SC 24-17. Once again, they were the beneficiary of three SC turnovers.

The one big strength for Vandy is their ability to stop the run. In their first two games they allowed less than 100 yards rushing. However, can they stop this Rice offense? We don't think so. Vandy hasn't been able to string more than two ATS wins together as they are an awful 9-22 ATS after back-to-back covers. For Rice, they're a pretty good bet when getting points posting a 15-6 ATS record as underdogs. We're taking the points! **3* Play on Rice**

Georgia Tech at Virginia Tech

The Yellow Jackets posted a win for us here last week as they won outright over Boston College. Georgia Tech's stats aren't that impressive from that game as they were only able to post 235 total yards. Their passing game was awful as they completed only SIX passes for a measly 73 yards. Their defense was okay allowing BC only

262 total yards. Remember BC has a new offense with Matt Ryan now in the NFL.

After getting upset at a neutral site by East Carolina, Virginia Tech rebounded with a non-lined win over Furman. A win is a win, but they didn't look that impressive in the 24-7 victory. It looked like Tech wasn't trying to score many points as all they did was run the football. The stats show them grinding out 261 yards on 48 attempts. They threw the football only 13 times, completing 7 for 68 yards.

The Sportsbooks look for Virginia Tech to knock off GA Tech as they are 7-point favorites. Last year the Hokies dominated the Jackets winning 27-3 as 2.5-point underdogs. This is a tough scheduling spot for Georgia Tech having to play back-to-back road games against pretty good teams. Meanwhile, it was an advantage for VT to play lowly Furman last week. We backed VT last week, and we're backing them against this Saturday. Virginia Tech isn't as strong as they've been in the past, and don't think they have enough offense to win this game by more than a touchdown. Paul Johnson, the ex-Navy boss has this team playing well and with confidence. Grab the points! **3* Play on Georgia Tech**

Ohio State at USC

Saturday, September 13th, 8:00 ET

Wow! Have the Buckeyes looked bad! After opening the season with an easy win over Youngstown State, they struggled last week against Ohio University. OSU pulled away in the fourth quarter thanks to a punt return for a touchdown to win 26-14, not coming close to covering as 35-point favorites. Everyone knows that Heisman

Trophy candidate Beanie Wells didn't play, but c'mon Buckeye fans, your squad looked awful. Based on the terrible showing the Buckeyes have dropped all the way

down to fifth in the National Polls.

The Ohio State defense looked slow and flat footed against Ohio University. The Bobcats were able to run for 145 yards against what was believed to be the top run defense in the country. USC can't wait to test out this "slow" defense!

Speaking of USC, they were off last week and watched the Buckeye game. Reports indicate that they stopped watching at halftime! Pete Carroll and his staff aren't bothering to look at any Ohio State game film, why bother?

In the single game that USC has played they went to Virginia and showed everyone why they should be the number one team in the country. As 21-point favorites they murdered the Cavaliers 52-7. They did it on the ground rushing for 218 yards and through the air passing it for 340 yards. In case you don't have a calculator handy that adds up to 558 total yards. Meanwhile, while their offense was getting all of the praise, the defense allowed only 187 yards, completely shutting down Virginia's rushing game for 32 yards on 21 carries.

If this game would have been played prior to Ohio State's sloppy performance last week, USC would have been four to six point favorites. Now, USC is a huge 10.5-point favorite. Is Ohio State that bad?

Ohio State has too many good players, and with a healthy Beanie Wells it should open up the passing game. If Ohio State gets any kind of game from quarterback Todd Boeckman, they should be able to keep this game close. Take the Buckeyes with the generous points. **3* Play on Ohio State**

Two MAC East upstart teams meet Saturday in upstate New York as Temple visits Buffalo. Head coach Turner Gill has the Bulls off to a 1-1 start with a 42-17 win over UTEP in their opener where they put up 484 yards of total offense. Last Saturday Buffalo played very well at Pittsburgh in a closer than expected 27-16 loss. The Bulls were outgained on the playing field by just 4 yards and they stayed inside the 13.5 point spread to get their backers the money. Meanwhile, Temple lost 12-9 in overtime at home to Connecticut. The Huskies responded to a Temple field goal by scoring a touchdown to end the game. As for this game versus Buffalo, we feel that the Owls will fall as flat as a pancake. The Bulls offense will be too strong for the Temple defense. Head coach Al Golden has his team headed in the right direction but he's in over his head in this game.

New England at New York Jets Sunday, September 14

New England lost quarterback Tom Brady for the season but I look for them to come back strong this week against an over-rated New York Jets team. There is a lot of hype on the Jets this year because of the acquisition of Brett Favre. However, New York doesn't have many tools in place around to complement Favre. New England has dominated this series in the past going 9-1 straight up and 7-3 against the spread in the last 10 meetings. The Patriots are underdogs in this game for only the sixth time in the last three seasons and they are 4-1 against the spread the last three years in that role. New England is 13-5 against the spread the last three seasons on the road. The Jets haven't fared well as small favorites as they are just 3-6-1 against the spread their last 10 times as favorites of four or fewer points. Look for the Patriots to step up in this one as they send the Jets to another loss in this series.

Rice at Vanderbilt Saturday, September 13

What's going on here? Both Rice and Vandy have opened 2-0 in the '08 season. Rice ended a 45-year bowl drought in '06 but then HC Todd Graham bolted for Tulsa and the Owls fell to 3-9 in '07. As for Vandy, the 'Dores haven't been to a bowl game since 1982 and entered this year with a streak of 25 consecutive losing seasons. Rice opened the year with a 56-27 home rout of SMU and then last Saturday at Memphis, scored the game's final 22 points in a 42-35 win.



Vandy opened the year with an impressive 34-13 road win at Miami-Ohio and they beat South Carolina 24-17 a week ago Thursday, the Commodores' first upset of a ranked team in Vanderbilt Stadium since September 19, 1992 (a 31-9 win over then-No. 25 Mississippi). Versatile QB Nickson has two TD passes (no INTs) plus 183 yards rushing and three more TDson the ground. The defense has been solid, allowing just 15.0 PPG in the two wins.

Rice has an explosive offense (49.0 PPG) led by QB Chase Clement, who has completed 61.7 percent for 576 yards with seven TDs and two INTs. He's also the team's leading rusher with 167 yards (6.0 YPC) and two more TDs. The Rice 'D' leaves a lot to be desired though, allowing 31.0 PPG and 430.0 YPG (last year allowed 42.9 PPG / 510.0 YPG). It's not easy for Rice to win away from home (needed 42 points to do so last Saturday), as in six road games last year, the Owls allowed 43.5 PPG. Vandy HC Bobby Johnson says "the ante has been raised" for his team this year and I'm calling for Vanderbilt to get its first 3-0 start since 1984 with a convincing win. Lay the points.

SMU at Texas Tech Saturday, August 13

This line is inflated for no real reason. Texas Tech may be 2-0 but the wins came against Eastern Washington and Nevada and the win against the Wolf Pack was very misleading. The Red Raiders may have won by 16 points but they were outgained 488-421 and they lost the time of possession battle by over 13 minutes. Texas Tech got a questionable call on a touchdown that was instead ruled a fumble and it also returned a punt 86 yards for a score.

SMU struggled in its opener against Rice in its first game in the new June Jones offense. The Mustangs then won on Saturday against Texas St. and even though it was not a good team nor an impressive win, it gave them an extra game to get the systems going and if for nothing else, provided some great confidence. SMU put up 431 total yards and even though the defense did not play well, in a game with a line like this, the offense won't need much for the cover.

Looking at Texas Tech message boards all the talk is about how many points the offense is going to score and how much the team is going to win by. I love seeing stuff like that. This offense has the potential to be one of the best around but the points aren't coming. Prior to Nevada, the Red Raiders came off a crushing win over Eastern Washington as they amassed 639 yards of total offense. However, this game was very much in doubt entering the fourth quarter as the Red Raiders were only up by 11 points.

Back to the Mustangs offense, quarterback Bo Levi Mitchell had quite a game, completing 24-of-37 pass attempts for 370 yards and five touchdowns against Texas St. SMU's five touchdown passes marked the first time the Mustangs have had that many since that Sam Houston State game in 2006. While they have had two games to get things clicking, the other side of the ball should help them out as well.

After two weeks, the Red Raiders rank 95th in the total defense and while they have stopped teams from scoring big, they are giving up chunks of yards that a Jones-made offense can take advantage of. This game has the makings of a shootout and with this line we are getting, Texas Tech can put up points in the 60's and the Mustangs can still cover rather comfortably. A win here is unlikely and that is something we normally look at when grabbing the underdog but a dog like this has tremendous value.

Michigan at Notre Dame Saturday, September 13

At 3:30 pm, our selection is on the Notre Dame Fighting Irish plus the points over Michigan. Last year, there were few bright spots for Lloyd Carr's Wolverines. His final season as head coach opened in disastrous fashion with a loss to Appalachian St, and then the Wolves got waxed by Oregon.

Still, Carr's season was better than Charlie Weis' year in South Bend, and Michigan's 38-0 romp over the Irish in Ann Arbor showed just how bad Notre Dame really was. This year, the Irish might surprise some folks, and I think they'll get their revenge on Saturday afternoon. Notre Dame falls into a 271-219 ATS shutout revenge system of mine, and also a team trend that's 14-1 ATS. These teams both saw their opening game finish above the total. The Bucs saw their game against the Saints sneak above the total with 44 combined points while the Falcons combined with the Lions for a whopping 54. Those results have helped keep tonight's total above the key number of 37, which I feel has provided us with solid value. A look at the recent meetings in this series show that all four games from the past two seasons produced 40 points or less. Those four games averaged just 29.5 points.



Give the Falcons credit for their opening day win. Everything went right and rookie QB Matt Ryan even threw a touchdown on his very first pass. That being said, Ryan and the Falcons will likely find things quite a lot tougher in their first road game. Note that the Bucs have seen the 'under' go 7-4 their last 11 home games and that they've held their six of their last nine opponents here to 14 points or less. Additionally, note that the Bucs have seen the 'under' go 6-2 their last eight home games played in the month of September. Looking back further and we find the 'under' at a profitable 38-20 in Tampa's last 58 September games.

The Bucs ran the ball effectively last week, but Gruden became impatient with the rushing attack a little too early and the Bucs ended up throwing more passes than he probably would have liked. Regardless of whether it's Garcia (currently questionable) or Griese, I expect the Bucs to feature a larger percentage of run plays this week. As for the Falcons, they threw just 13 passes last week to go along with their 42 plays on the ground. With Ryan still learning the offense and considering last week's success, we should see another heavy dose of the run. As you know, running plays help to keep the clock moving.

The Bucs have shown a tendency to play relatively low-scoring games when listed as favorites. Indeed, the 'under' is 81-51-1 (61%) their last 133 in that role. Look for this afternoon's game to prove lower-scoring than expected once again with the 'under' improving to 9-1 the last 10 times that the Falcons played on natural grass. Consider the UNDER

Oregon at Purdue Saturday, September 13

I'm laying the points with Oregon on Saturday. This line shot up dramatically in the first 24-hours after it opened, and rightly so. In fact, although it jumped from Oregon minus-5, to as high as minus-8, I still didn't think it was high enough. This is Joe Tiller's final season in West Lafayette, and I expect the Boilermakers to be fired-up to close out his coaching career on a high note. But the fact is, the talent for a strong season just isn't there. While Tiller did his best to revolutionize offenses in the Big-10 conference, he could never recruit well enough to consistently compete with Michigan, Ohio State, and Wisconsin.

This year's squad returns just 12 starters, second fewest in the conference, and they lost 23 lettermen from a year ago. That's bad news playing in a top heavy conference. Challenging for an upper division finish is likely going to be too tough. The Boilermakers struggled on both sides of the ball last week. While that seems like a strange statement when you see they won 42-10, it must be noted that the final score did not represent the actual play on the field.

Purdue hosted Northern Colorado, a FCS-subdivision team that finished 1-11 a season ago. And, while Purdue finished the game with a 42-10 victory, they did not look too good for much of the game. Purdue led just 14-0 at the break, and 21-0 after three quarters. Two of those first three touchdowns came from special teams results. The Boilermakers tipped one punt and recovered at the UNC 37, scoring a few plays later. The third TD came on a blocked-punt for a score. Tiller's squad ended with five fewer first downs than Northern Colorado, and got out-gained on the ground, 122-116. Now, they face a multi-talented Pac-10 team, a conference Purdue has struggled against. They're also just 12-34 SU against Top-25 teams under Joe Tiller.

I truly expect Purdue's back-seven on defense to have their hands full in this one. There are four new starters in the group and they will be tested by an Oregon offense that has rolled-up 110 points in their first two games. Oregon is at least top-3 on both sides of the line of scrimmage in the Pac-10, a much more dangerous conference than the Big-10.

QB Justin Roper came back in the win over Utah State after suffering a concussion in the opener against Washington. Roper and his backups, Jeremiah Masoli and Chris Harper, all look more than capable of leading the Ducks to a big season. And, to show how deep this offense is, RB Jeremiah Johnson was injured last week against USU, but highly-touted juco-transfer LeGarrette Blount showed what all the hype was about by running for 132 yards at 7.3 yards per carry. By the way, three running backs had at least 10 carries each. All three averaged at least 6.5 yards per carry. I expect Oregon to roll over another Big-10 opponent once again. Thanks! GL! Scott.

In past meetings (Steelers have won 15 of the past 17), the Browns have attempted to pressure Steelers' QB Roethlisberger with a steady dose of blitz schemes. The defensive strategy has not worked well enough and the Browns will undoubtedly adopt a defensive game plan that bends but does not break. The Eagles defense under DC Johnson has done this for the past several seasons. It essentially allows the opposition to move the ball in little chunks and then tighten up dramatically as the offense approaches the red zone. This is effective because the end zone acts as a backboard and the defense becomes less concerned with the deep routes.

The Texans did this last week and kept Roethlisberger and the Steelers offense from making huge plays and exploiting any blitz that was minimized by the OL. The Steelers will want to control the LOS with the punishing running game. Parker had an excellent game last week and it was based on running at the interior line and then bounding out to the side lines for additional yards. Cleveland has the personnel that will be disciplined enough NOT to collapse on the initial OL surge and will prevent the bounce to the perimeter.

The exact same game plan will occur when Cleveland has the ball and the Steelers will be even more effective in preventing scoring drives. Cleveland has to reply on executing pass routes and this will prove difficult against the Steelers secondary.

Cleveland will want to keep the game as close as possible and shorten the game to the 4th quarter where they would have a chance for the upset. The Steelers will want to wear down the Browns defensive front over the first 3 periods. Remember though, this fundamental analysis serves only to reinforce the grading produced by the Ai Simulator.
