Panic or Patience?

We're just two weeks into the NFL Betting Season and already there are some surprises. Namely, there are a number of teams sitting at 0-2 that you just wouldn't have thought would be in such a position prior to the season commencing. Ten of the league's 32 clubs are currently sitting in the precarious 0-2 hole, three of which were in the playoffs a season ago. A fourth, the Cleveland Browns, was a 10-game winner in 2007. The questions now are who should be panicking and who should be showing patience?

Clearly, the most noteworthy 0-2 team is the San Diego Chargers, the first club in the NFL history to lose its first two games of the season after leading at the 59:30 mark. Snakebitten by a Jake Delhomme touchdown pass on the final play of the opening day, the Lightning Bolts were flat out robbed in Week 2 via an atrocious officiating error at Denver. They did manage a cover, however, as 1.5-point chalk thanks to Broncos coach Mike Shanahan deciding to go for two in the waning seconds. This week won't be nearly as easy for the Chargers to cover as they are now nine-point home chalk over the Jets on Monday Night Football.

There are two 0-2 favorites on Sunday's card. One is the Minnesota Vikings, who host the 2-0 Carolina Panthers. Vikings fans are already booing QB Tarvaris Jackson as the passing game appears to be non-existent. Minnesota was one of eight teams in Week 2 to blow a 4th Quarter lead and lose, letting the Colts rally from a 15-0 hole and thus avoid an 0-2 hole of their own. Note that the unbeaten Panthers get back suspended WR Steve Smith this week.

The other 0-2 Sunday favorite is the Seattle Seahawks. Here, it is definitely time to hit the

panic button. Besieged by numerous injuries, the Seahawks opened the year with an ugly 34-10 loss at Buffalo and then lost at home to San Francisco in overtime in Week 2. Last year, they outscored the 49ers 47-3 in the two meetings. Mike Holmgren probably can't wait to give this team away to Jim Mora, Jr, although drawing the atrocious Rams this week can only help. Seattle is a big 9.5-point home favorite for this battle of 0-2 teams.

Jacksonville won a playoff game last year, but is winless so far this season. A road loss within the division to Tennessee is excusable, but they will probably want Sunday's 20-16 home loss to the Bills back after leading 16-13 in the 4th quarter. The Jags have a critical game this week at Indianapolis and are currently 5.5-point dogs.

The other 0-2 teams are: Miami, Cincinnati, Kansas City, St. Louis, Detroit and Cleveland. The first five were to be expected as that quintet likely comprises your "Worst Five Teams in the League" list. Cleveland is another team that should be hitting the panic button, however, as they've opened with back-to-back home losses and have scored just 16 points. What appears to be an idiotic coaching staff does not help either. All six teams in this group are underdogs in Week Three.

Unlike the Ohio State Buckeyes, we don't want to forget about what happened in College Football last weekend. Southern Cal took a giant step towards a possible berth in the BCS Title Game with their lopsided 35-3 win Saturday night. All that stands between the Trojans and an unbeaten season is a weak Pac 10 schedule (and Notre Dame). USC has yet another bye week coming up this weekend.

Everyone wants to rightfully rip the Big Ten, Big East and ACC, but the Pac 10 deserves its fair share of criticism after last Saturday's results. UCLA was humiliated 59-0 at BYU, Arizona State lost

LSU at Auburn Saturday, September 20

The winner of this particular matchup has taken the SEC West Division title 6 of the last 8 years, so the game's importance cannot be understated. That trend was continued last year when LSU pulled off a semi-miraculous 30-24 victory in Baton Rouge en route to another National Championship. Having walked away with the cash as 10-point underdogs probably isn't enough to console Auburn, as they led the Tigers 17-7 at the half only to allow a 22-yard TD pass with one second remaining. If you remember, that final play was a memorable decision by LSU coach Les Miles, who opted to bypass a potential game-tying FG in favor of going for the win on 4th down.

Therefore, this sets up as a big revenge spot for Auburn. One trend working in their favor is that the home team has won each of the last eight meetings in this head-to-head series with the average win coming by nine points per game. The last time the Bayou Bengals came calling we saw the lowest scoring game at Jordan-Hare Stadium since 1973 with Auburn walking away a 7-3 winner as three-point chalk. Due to a less than stellar 3-2 win over Mississippi State last week, we're actually getting points with the home side this go around and while the new offense is clearly still undergoing a steep learning curve, the Auburn defense is just awesome. They are giving up just five points per game through three games and allowing just 1.8 yards per rush. LSU has played a pair of cupcakes in preparation for this one and will not even come within a whiff of their 41 point/game average here. With points at a premium, we side with the home dog, who likely will win outright.

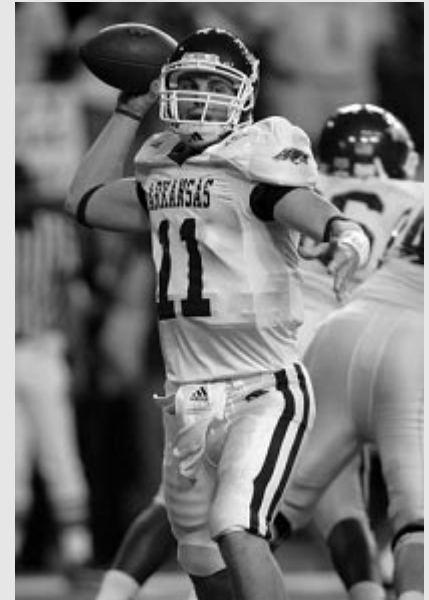

Alabama at Arkansas Saturday, September 20

Both teams head into their first SEC conference battle undefeated, with Alabama (3-0) heading to Arkansas (2-0). Alabama is anchored by a superior defensive unit that has held ALL 3 opponents to 10 points and a combined 128 total rushing yards that's only 43 yards per game! Those solid numbers have caused the public to jump on this line as the price continues to rise. Points are usually at a premium in these tightly played SEC games, so we'll take them knowing that Alabama has struggled to a 2-5 ATS record against conference foes behind Head Coach Nick Saban. The double digits look even more tempting with Arkansas hosting this game, knowing that Saban's Crimson Tide was just 1-4 ATS away from home last year.

outright as 22.5-point home chalk to UNLV, and Arizona was another outright loser to New Mexico. Oregon did an admirable job carrying the conference flag, winning at Purdue, but did not cover.

That leaves the SEC and Big 12 as the two premier conferences in the country. In the SEC, we'll have to wait until 11/1 for the big showdown between Florida and Georgia, but the SEC West race will begin to take shape after this weekend with Auburn hosting LSU as a three-point home dog. Tuberville's Tigers come off a lackluster 3-2 win over Mississippi State while Miles' Tigers crushed overmatched North Texas, 42-3. The home team has won eight straight

in this series (by an average of 9 PPG) and this is a huge revenge spot for Auburn.

Nothing really interesting going on in the Big 12 this week as Oklahoma is off and Missouri is a 33.5-point favorite against Buffalo in non-conference play. These teams don't play during the regular season, but a potential matchup in the Conference Championship would be the third game to shape the BCS Title Game.

What then are the other big college games this week then? Well, Georgia makes its first non-conference road trip (besides Georgia Tech) since 1995 when they travel to Arizona State. This game lost a bit of its luster, however, when the Sun Devils got

caught looking ahead against UNLV. The Bulldogs are currently favored by seven points. The other SEC power, Florida, is a 7.5-point favorite at Tennessee. If you want to look outside the SEC, North Carolina is a two-point favorite over Virginia Tech in an important ACC Coastal Division battle.

Oakland at Buffalo

Sunday, September 21st, 1:00 ET

Is there a more bizarre situation in the entire NFL than the Oakland Raiders coaching situation? Raiders coach Lane Kiffin appears to not want his job, nor does he seem to be wanted to management (read: Al Davis), yet the Silver and Black were somehow able to come out and pick up a road win at Kansas City last week (called it here in the EDGE!), just six days removed from a horrible 41-14 home loss on MNF to division rival Denver. This week, things will be much more difficult as they make a dangerous cross-country trip to take on the 2-0 Bills.

Buffalo has not started a season 3-0 since back in the Jim Kelly and Thurman Thomas days of 1992. However, this looks like the year. They've allowed just 26 points total in their first two games, both covers against playoff teams from last year. They have not been this substantial a favorite since the final week of the 2004 season when they played a 14-1 Pittsburgh team that was resting all of its starters. By the way, the Bills lost that game outright 29-24.

Don't look for that same scenario to unfold this week, however, as Dick Jauron's team is 8-1 vs. the number when coming off a SU win as a dog. Buffalo has actually lost four straight times to the Raiders, but all of those games came during Oakland's renaissance period under Jon Gruden.

Since 1983, road underdogs off an upset win by two touchdowns or more are a hideous 54-102 (35%) against the spread. With the Bills at 5-1 ATS their last six games as a favorite and 12-5 ATS at home under Jauron, this one is a no-brainer. **3* on Buffalo**

Jacksonville at Indianapolis

Sunday, September 21st, 4:15 ET

We now turn our focus to some 0-2 teams that are desperate for a win and getting points in Week 3 action. We start with the Jacksonville Jaguars, who let one slip away last week at home against the aforementioned Bills. Already down two games in the AFC South standings to first place

Tennessee, who beat Del Rio's team in Week One, this one is "must win" for winless Jacksonville, as difficult a task as that may seem considering they are travelling to rival Indianapolis this week.

However, the visitor is on a 6-2-1 ATS run in this series and overall the Jags are 7-4-1 ATS the L12 meetings. The road team covered both meetings last year, including Jacksonville covering a seven-point spot in a 28-25 loss.

All this negative talk about the Jaguars almost serves as a diversion from the fact that Indianapolis is not playing particularly well either. They lost their home opener, 29-17, to Chicago in a Sunday Night contest where they were favored by 9.5 points. Last week, they trailed Minnesota on the road, 15-0, before a 4th quarter rally from Peyton Manning saved them.

The Colts are really having trouble running the ball. In their first two games, they have rushed for 71 yards total. Jacksonville is having its only problems on the ground as Maurice Jones-Drew and Fred Taylor have combined for 80 yards total in two games.

With both teams struggling, the points become attractive in a situation like this, particularly because the dog is in a "must win" situation. Note that the Jags have not lost by more than a touchdown in Indy the last three times they've lost here and even won outright back in 2004. **3* on Jacksonville.**

Cleveland at Baltimore

Sunday, September 14th, 4:15 ET

Another 0-2 team facing a "must win" situation on the road this week is Cleveland, who has begun the year with back-to-back home losses. The Browns must now play BB division games on the road after losing (again) to rival Pittsburgh last Sunday Night, 10-6.

We've got the feeling that the once vaunted Cleveland offense is in for a breakout game here. The team started last year by cashing 10 straight Over tickets and wound up averaging over 25 points/game on the season. However, they haven't scored more than 30 in eight straight games, all of which have gone Under.

The good news is that Cleveland has covered each of the last four meetings in this series and after last week's "back-door" cover the team is a perfect 7 for 7 ATS when coming off a SU loss. Baltimore is in a bizarre spot, having had an early bye week due to Hurricane Ike, which forced last week's scheduled matchup in Houston to be cancelled. We think that unusual set of circumstances will halt the momentum they had from an opening week win over a terrible Cincinnati team.

Back to the Cleveland offense. Right now, they are tied with the awful Rams for lowest scoring average in the league at 8.0 PPG. However, last year, they averaged 30 points per game against this Baltimore offense. With the Ravens at 4-13 ATS their L17 games overall and 0-7 ATS coming off a home game, we are calling for the outright upset here. **3* on Cleveland**

Vanderbilt at Ole Miss

Saturday, September 20th, 7:00 ET

What in the world is going on down in Nashville, Tennessee? As always, the SEC was figured to be the strongest league in the country this season, but Vanderbilt was never alleged to be a part of that predicted prowess. The Commodores have had two legit shots at winning seasons in the last three years, but late season collapses cost them both times. They own, by far, the SEC's longest bowl drought at 25 years, which is 21 years longer than the next longest drought, owned by Ole Miss. These two teams meet this week in Oxford.

Vandy is off to a 3-0 SU/ATS starts this season, with two of those wins coming as dogs. Last week, they crushed Rice, 38-21, as 9.5-point chalk. However, that would appear to set them up for their first defeat of the year as the Commodores are just 5-17 vs. the number off a win by 17 points or more, including 2-14 ATS if that win came at home. Another thing that works against Vanderbilt this week is a 4-21 mark in SEC road games under Coach Bobby Johnson, including a 1-5 record in SEC road openers. The home team is 6-1 in this series since 2001 as well, with the average win coming by nearly double-digits.

Therefore (as if you couldn't already tell) we're siding with the Rebels here. They've had a week to get over a tough home loss to Wake Forest (took their frustration out on Samford, 34-10, last Saturday) and are 5-1 ATS when coming off a win in Oxford. Houston Nutt and his new regime will be eager to erase the program's four-year losing skid in conference openers. **3* on Ole Miss.**

Central Michigan at Purdue

Saturday, September 20th, 12:00 ET

This is a rematch of last year's memorable Motor City Bowl that saw the teams combine for an incredible 99 points (won by Purdue 51-48). That game was a rematch in its own right as earlier in the season the Boilermakers crushed the Chippewas 45-22 right here in West Lafayette, so these

teams are quite familiar with one another at this point. Scoring lots of points has always been a good thing for Joe Tiller, who is coaching his final season at Purdue, as the Boilermakers have scored 40 or more points 34 times during Tiller's 12-year tenure at the school. The Boilermakers are an incredible 34-0 in those games.

However, we don't think it will be enough here. The line has dropped in half from what it was in last year's regular season meeting, thus showing how the gap in talent has shrunk between the two schools. There appears to be a nationwide trend that has the gap between BCS schools and non-BCS schools shrinking. Particularly, this seems to be the case when comparing the Big Ten and the MAC. Already this season, we've seen Ohio State struggle to beat Ohio and Michigan do the same against Miami.

Last week's results also set up a play on the underdog here. Purdue really let one slip away against Oregon, falling 32-26 in overtime, after being outscored 17-3 in the second half. After a tough non-conference loss like that, it's pretty tough to see the Boilermakers getting up for this one as double digit favorites.

Central Michigan comes off a 31-28 win over Ohio where they were actually outgained by the Bobcats. However, they are 13-1 vs. the number when coming off a road game over the last three seasons and their familiarity with the opponent leads us to believe they will stay within the number. **3* on Central Michigan.**

Florida at Tennessee

Saturday, September 20th, 3:30 ET

How bad does Tennessee's loss to UCLA look now after the Bruins went out and lost 59-0 to BYU last Saturday? The Vols did come back with a 35-3 win over UAB last week, but just missed out on covering the 33-point number. Off to an 0-2 ATS start, they take a huge step up in class this week when they host rival Florida, who is off a bye week no less.

Whoever wins the rushing battle usually wins this game as the team with the rushing edge has won 16 of the previous 18 meetings. Florida has done so each of the last three years and not coincidentally has come out the victor all three times. Last year's 59-20 victory in Gainesville was the Gators biggest win in the 37-year history of the rivalry and the worst loss of Phil Fulmer's career in Knoxville. Tim Tebow went 14 of 19 in that game for 299 yards and had four touchdowns (2 passing and 2 rushing). Tennessee has averaged 13 rushing yards/game in the last two meetings.

Getting more than a touchdown at home with the Vols might seem attractive, mainly because Florida managed just 89 yards rushing in their 26-3 win over Miami, but the reality is that this is a National Title Contender against a team that will be lucky to be playing in the Chick Fil-A Bowl. Urban Meyer is 8-5-1 ATS as a single-digit road fave in SEC play and the program has cashed 10 of its last 14 SEC openers overall. **3* on Florida.**

Temple at Penn State Saturday, September 20

Penn State has taken no prisoners in their first two lined games this year winning at home over Oregon St, 45-14, and on the road in the Carrier Dome, 55-13, over Syracuse. The Nittany Lions gained a combined 1014 yards in those two games. They now face a Temple team that figures to have no gas in the tank after two straight demoralizing losses. Two weeks ago, the Owls lost at home to Connecticut in overtime and last week they lost to Buffalo on a Hail Mary pass on the last play of the game. Joe Paterno is not one to call off the dogs. With the Nittany Lions hitting on all cylinders and the Owls needing to see a shrink, this game has blowout written all over it. Keep the women and children at home.

Both of these teams got their offense on track last week and I look for it to carry over to this Sunday's game. Arizona has gone Over the total in five of their last six games overall. The Cardinals have played high scoring games on the road recently as 10 of their last 13 road contests have gone Over the number. They have gone Over the total in four of their last five trips to Washington, and seen the Over go 15-5 their last 20 games when listed as an underdog. The Redskins have gone Over the total in four of their last six home games, including last week's win over New Orleans. They have gone Over the total in their last four games versus NFC West opponents, and gone Over the total in nine of their last 13 games with a line of three or less. Look for another high scoring game today as this one sails Over the number.

Idaho at Utah State Saturday, September 20

Robb Akey is in his second year as Idaho's head coach and he's 2-13 SU. The wins have come over two Division I-AA schools, Cal Poly last year (20-13) and Idaho State this year (42-27). Meanwhile, Utah State's Brent Guy is in his fifth year at Logan and after an 0-3 start to '08, he's 6-32 as the Aggies head coach. Utah State was competitive in Las Vegas against UNLV on August 30 (lost 27-17) but the Aggies were "in over their



heads" the last two Saturdays, allowing 66 points at Oregon and 58 at home to Utah last week. That 58-10 loss marked Utah State's eighth straight home defeat (1-7 ATS), which represents the longest active home losing streak in CFB. However, the visiting Vandals own a nine-game road losing streak entering this Saturday's contest, allowing an average of 47.0 PPG. Idaho QB Nathan Enderle (334 YP and three TD passes last week) and RB Deonte' Jackson (1,175 YR in '07 and back-to-back 100-yard games in '08) give the Vandals more offensive 'punch' than the Aggies but I'm taking Idaho away from home, considering its current record. Utah State won last year's game in Moscow, 24-19, despite being outgained 428 to 272 in yards. Four Idaho turnovers were the difference and while one can't "count on getting turnovers," one also can't rely on the poor-traveling Vandals in this price range, either.

Florida Atlantic at Minnesota Saturday, September 20

The Gophers are 3-0 coming off a dismal 1-11 campaign last season. Minnesota has been solid on offense, which was expected, as it has averaged 36 ppg through those first three games. The Gophers should once again be able to move the chains and put up points against a very suspect Florida Atlantic defense. In last year's meeting, Minnesota put up 470 total yards and there is no reason to think it cannot do it again.



The Owls are coming off a loss, this time a shutout at Michigan St. The 17-0 final may have looked close but it could have been a lot worse if not for the bad weather that took place in East Lansing. The Spartans put up 250 yards rushing, but because of the bad weather they were able to go only 3-15 on third down and that resulted in opportunities lost. Florida Atlantic has now scored a total of 10 points in two road games.

Minnesota went to Bowling Green earlier this season and avenged a loss from last season and it has the chance to do it again. The Gophers lost some tough games last season and one of those was a three-point setback in Boca Raton, so revenge is once again in play here. Minnesota was favored by a touchdown in that game and it is now favored by the same amount but this time it is at home.

Minnesota has nine returning starters on offense, including quarterback Adam Weber, who led the offense in rushing and passing last year. It finished 48th in total offense which was outstanding considering it was the first year the new offense was in place. In the second year, things are coming together. The Gophers are 15th in the nation in passing efficiency while Florida Atlantic is 92nd in passing efficiency defense.

Overall, the Owls are 105th in total defense and 103rd in scoring defense, so they could once again be in for a long one. Another key factor for the Gophers' turnaround has been turnovers. Minnesota finished 114th in the country in turnover margin last season as it gave it up 1.25 times per game. This year it is a complete turnaround as they are 3rd in the nation at +2.67. Look for the Gophers to continue their run and get their revenge Saturday.

LA Dodgers at Pittsburgh (MLB) Wednesday, September 17

The Pittsburgh Pirates have not made the playoffs since 1992, so perhaps they are secretly enjoying the Milwaukee Brewers collapse (the Brewers' playoff drought is currently 26 years), as Milwaukee's success would make the Buccos look even worse since they're both small-market franchise that play in the National League Central.

Certainly, Major League Baseball does not have a level playing field, which is why the Pirates played the role of "enabler" in the 3-team deal earlier this season which solved both the Dodgers' and Boston's problems, and allowed the Red Sox to send Manny Ramirez to Los Angeles for the Pirates' Jason Bay. So, Boston and Los Angeles will once again be in the Playoffs, while teams like Pittsburgh (which seemingly only operate to develop talent for the big money clubs) will be at home in October.

In Wednesday's game, the pitching matchup clearly favors Los Angeles, as Chad Billingsley takes the mound against Zach Duke. Billingsley has a 3-0 record over his last 3 starts with a 1.86 ERA, and he's 2-0 in his career vs. Pittsburgh. Duke, meanwhile, as struggled vs. LA, as his career ERA is north of 7 runs per game vs. the Dodgers, and he's 5-14 on the season. Take Los Angeles.

We won with an 'under' with last week's EDGE selection, as Tampa Bay shut down Atlanta. This week, we'll go with an 'over' selection instead. Currently down to 35 at many books, this is among the lowest totals on the Week 3 board. I feel that it's too low. These teams last met in 2006, a December game which was also played here at Chicago. That game was expected to be low-scoring, as it also had an



over/under line of 35. However, it finished with a whopping 65 points. You might be surprised to find out that, including that meeting vs. the Bucs, the Bears have seen 15 of their last 20 home games eclipse the total. As for the Bucs, dating back to last season, they've seen seven straight road games produce a minimum of 38 points. Those seven games averaged 42.86 combined points and six of them finished above the number.

The luck of the leprechaun was back in South Bend last week as the Irish caught every break in the book to open up a quick lead on Michigan. The Wolverines QB situation is so bad, that they never had a chance to catch Notre Dame once they fell behind by a couple of scores. Michigan went into the contest banged-up on the offensive line and Notre Dame was never really challenged.

But it's hard to imagine that they could catch breaks like that for the second straight week, especially away from home. The Irish must do everything they can to avoid falling behind early in East Lansing. A fortunate win over a re-tooling Michigan team does not erase a year's worth of horrible memories.

The Notre Dame offense, or lack of it, will have to face the stout Spartan defense this week. Michigan State had their troubles in their season-opener at California, but the Golden Bears are a potent team at home. It was also the first game for five new defensive starters. So, after losing 38-31, defensive-minded HC Mark Dantonio and DC Pat Narduzzi, re-grouped and focused on the stop-unit for the entire following week of practice. The results have been outstanding. And, while some will cite the fact that the strong numbers came against Eastern Michigan and Florida Atlantic, I'd reply by saying Notre Dame's offense more closely resembles those two opponents than it does California's when playing in Berkeley.

The fact is, MSU held their last two opponents to just 4.7 yards per play, allowing just 567 yards on 120 plays. They've allowed just 3.8 yards rushing the last two weeks. And, they have been absolutely nasty against the pass, holding EMU & FAU to 22-of-65 combined passing, a miserable 34% completion rate, with a stingy 5.5 yards per pass and no touchdowns allowed. I expect the stop-unit to continue their dominance against an Irish offense that's averaging just 4.89 yards per play.

Notre Dame has not been able to generate a ground game as of yet. They ran the ball for just 113 yards on 34 carries against that "defensive juggernaut", San Diego State, and then ran for only 105 yards on 34 carries against Michigan. That's an anemic 218 yards on 68 carries, or 3.21 yards per carry. Not good! QB Jimmy Clausen needs a running game, not just good luck, to throw the ball effectively. In fact, he finished just 10-of-21 against SDSU and he's thrown two interceptions in each of his first two games...both at home.

Finally, Notre Dame has some seriously poor bankroll numbers to overcome before I can jump on board. They're 1-5 SU/ATS as a dog in a price range that includes this number and 3-8 ATS in their last 11 September contests. Michigan State fits a college football angle that indicates hot home faves remain hot. Home teams favored by 3 1/2 to 10 points are a healthy, 40-12 ATS over the last five seasons if they're off a home win of at least 17 points. MSU fits the bill, having defeated FAU, 17-0 in the rain last weekend. I'm laying the points with Michigan State on Saturday. Thanks! GL! Scott.

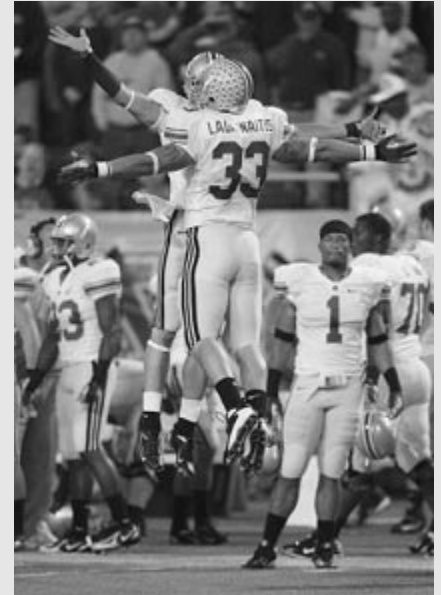
