More Questions Than Answers

There are certainly more questions than answers after three weeks of play in the 2008 NFL Regular Season. This is particularly true in the AFC. Coming into the season, there were four teams that were thought to be head and shoulders above the rest of the conference: New England, San Diego, Indianapolis and Jacksonville. Those teams are a collective 5-7 SU/ATS right now.

No one could have predicted the quartet that remains unbeaten after Week 3: Buffalo, Denver, Tennessee and Baltimore, who are a collective 8-3 ATS (Baltimore has played just two games). However, are any of these teams legit contenders?

Buffalo's forecast looks pretty strong as they've beaten a pair of playoff teams from last year (Seattle and Jacksonville). However, they were never in position to cover the 9.5-point number in last week's win over Oakland. A very favorable schedule that includes such weaklings as St. Louis, Miami (twice), Cleveland, Kansas City and San Francisco leads us to believe that the Bills will end their postseason drought. This week, they are a big eight-point road favorite over a horrible St. Louis team.

Tennessee might be 3-0 SU/ATS, but they have Kerry Collins under center for crying out loud. The Titans do lead the league in scoring defense, however, so can they make it 4-0 SU/ATS this week laying a small three-point number against 1-2 Minnesota?

Denver might be 3-0 straight up, but they easily could be 1-2, which would match their current ATS record. They literally stole one from San Diego in Week 2 and last week the Broncos were very fortuitous to come away a 34-32 winner over New Orleans at home. Pretty tough to buy into a team that has allowed 70 points over the last two weeks. That being said, they are a 9.5-point favorite this

week over a Chiefs team that has scored just 32 points in three games.

Baltimore is off to a surprising 2-0 start, but the pair of victories has come against opponents that are a combined 0-6 SU. We'll find out if they are for real this week as they are an eight-point underdog at Pittsburgh Monday night.

Then again, the supposed legit contenders aren't exactly giving backers much hope either. New England got the Matt Cassel era off to a nice start with a 19-10 win over the Jets, but then laid an absolute egg at home against Miami, losing by 25 as 13-point favorites. Jacksonville very easily could be 0-3 if not for a last second win at Indianapolis, who also very easily could be 0-3 if not for a 4th quarter rally at Minnesota the week prior. San Diego is probably okay after a Monday Night win over the Jets. This week, New England and Indianapolis are both off, Jacksonville is a 7.5-point home choice over 0-2 Houston and San Diego is favored by a touchdown at Oakland.

Over in the NFC, Dallas is clearly the team to beat in the conference, if not the entire league. They are the biggest Week 4 favorite on the board, laying double-digits to division rival Washington, who is off back-to-back wins.

The Cowboys biggest competition is likely to come out of its own division. The Giants might be #2 in your power rankings. After all, they are 3-0 and the defending Super Bowl Champions. However, their last two wins have come against the Rams and Bengals. The G-Men are off this week, so we'll still have to wait and see how good they are. Philadelphia is a strong 2-1 with their only loss coming by four at Dallas (covered as 6.5-point dogs) and will be a road favorite at Chicago on Sunday Night.

Let's talk some College Football, as once again the week's biggest game comes from the SEC. #3 Georgia hosts #8 Alabama Saturday night with the

Colorado State at California Saturday, September 27

Three weeks ago, right here in the EDGE, we told you that there is often value to be found on large College Football favorites, given the situation. We made good on that promise with a 56-10 winner on Florida (-35). Well, on this Saturday's card, we have found another substantial favorite worth playing on, only this time you don't have to lay quite that many points.

California had last week off to recoup from its outright loss at Maryland two weeks ago as a late rally was not enough to avoid an eight-point loss as 13.5-point chalk. After a good looking 2-0 start that saw them beat a ranked Michigan State team and then Washington State on the road (66-3!), the Bears offense took the week off against the Terps as they did not score a TD until the 4th quarter. However, Colorado State is a weak opponent that they will be able to rack up a lot of points against.

Last year, these teams played a tight game in Fort Collins with Cal coming out on top 34-28. Now, that the matchup is in Berkley, expect a far different result. This is Colorado State's first "true" road game of the season. The Rams were 0-5 away from home last year. The aforementioned 2007 meeting with Cal wasn't nearly as close as the final score might indicate as CSU scored a pair of late touchdowns to pull within six. They are 7-41 all-time vs. Pac 10 teams. They've lost their last nine road games overall. In their only venture off campus this year (against Colorado), they allowed 38 points, a number that is very likely to be topped here against a Cal team that has averaged nearly 44 PPG so far this season.

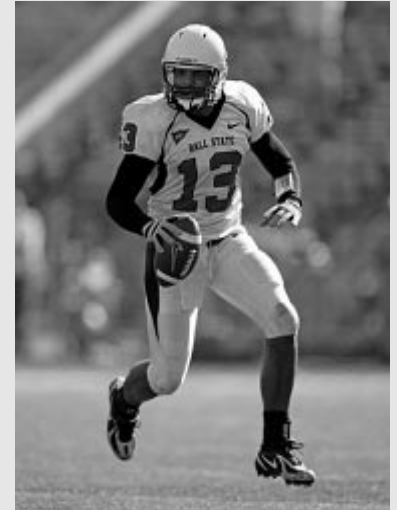

Kent at Ball State Saturday, September 27

It won't be long before the public realizes that Ball State (4-0 SU & 3-0 ATS) is a solid football team this year. In fact, Ball State has been one of College Football's biggest cash machines, owning an 18-8 ATS record during their last 26 games, including a perfect 7-0 ATS mark in September. We cashed on them two weeks back as our "Friday Night Fight" selection as they destroyed Navy, 35-23.



Willing to lay the double digits this Saturday as they return home following back-to-back road games to host a Kent State (1-3) squad whose three losses were by 21, 20 and 17 points! The last time these squads met was two years ago, with Ball State winning at home, 30-6. Lay the lumber as we find Ball State at 6-1 ATS as home favorites against an opponent seeking revenge!

Bulldogs laying about a touchdown. 'Bama hasn't beaten UGA since 1995 (met three times), with two of the losses, including last year's, coming by just a field goal.

The SEC's other top five team, Florida, is a big 24.5-point favorite at home over Ole Miss this week. The Gators look like a strong national title contender at 3-0 ATS and have outscored their opponents by a collective 112-19 margin. Another SEC game worth noting has #15 Auburn hosting struggling Tennessee. Both teams are coming off losses and the Tigers currently check in as a touchdown choice.

We haven't mentioned the Big 10 yet, and

for good reason. This conference looks dreadful with preseason favorite Ohio State really struggling right now. The Buckeyes draw Minnesota this week and are favored by 17.5 points at the betting window. Two teams that we will learn a lot about this week are Penn State and Wisconsin. Penn State is a two-touchdown choice over last year's Rose Bowl representative, Illinois, in primetime. Wisconsin is a road favorite at Michigan. This is just the seventh time since 1992 that the Wolverines have been a dog at the Big House.

Top-ranked USC is back in action and will get the new week of betting underway on

Thursday as they travel to Oregon State as 25-point favorites. Remember, two years ago, the Beavers beat the Trojans here in Corvallis as 10-point underdogs. Southern Cal will be a big favorite in all remaining games and may wind up as the Pac 10's lone ranked team by season's end.

San Francisco at New Orleans Sunday, September 28th, 1:00 ET

This is an overlay due to past meetings and public perception. Before realignment, these two teams used to meet twice per season. San Francisco dominated that old NFC West era. However, the two teams have met each of the last two years, and the Saints have absolutely dominated. They've outscored the Niners by a combined margin of 65-20, which includes a 34-10 win here in the Big Easy in 2006.

However, this is not the same Saints team. They come in banged up and off back-to-back losses. The passing game, which has been the hallmark of the offense under Sean Payton, is now lacking with major injuries to WR Marques Colston and TE Jeremy Shockey. With two major weapons no longer in the lineup, it's tough to see New Orleans maintaining its 26.7 PPG average.

What you may not know is that San Francisco's offense is actually averaging nearly as many points as that of the Saints through three games. Under new offensive coordinator Mike Martz, the Niners are putting up 25.7 PPG, just one point less than New Orleans. Even more impressive is that San Fran has put up back-to-back 30-plus point efforts in wins over Seattle and Detroit. The key to Martz offense has been an average of eight yards per pass attempt.

Under Payton, New Orleans is just 6-12 ATS at the Superdome. They did cash in this year's home opener, but barely, as three-point favorites in a 24-20 win over Tampa Bay. As mentioned previously, the Saints come off a pair of excruciating losses; one to Washington where they blew a nine-point fourth quarter lead and another to Denver where they missed a potential GW FG with under 1:00 to play. **3* on San Francisco**

San Diego at Oakland Sunday, September 28th, 4:05 ET

The Raiders certainly aren't going to feel for the Chargers following San Diego's 1-2 start. That's because the Silver and Black have plenty of turmoil within their own franchise, so much so that we've reached near unprecedented levels of absurdity. In all due respect, Al Davis needs to go. He is

embarrassing himself, his coach, his team and the entire league. This is a jealous man who sabotaged his own franchise several years ago when he fired a great coach in Jon Gruden, who supplanted Davis as the new face of the franchise for all the right reasons. Granted, the Raiders went to the Super Bowl the year after Gruden was let go, but they lost to their former coach in that big game and have gone just 20-63 in the four-plus subsequent regular seasons. What a joke.

Oakland comes off a tough 24-23 last second loss at Buffalo last week, so morale should be at an all-time low, which is saying something. This team has been simply awful as a home dog, going 10-22 ATS the last 32 times they've been in that role. They've lost 11 of their last 13 home games SU, including a 41-14 loss to Denver in the 2008 home opener, which ran their ATS mark to 3-10 over that same time frame.

This has been a very one-sided rivalry recently. San Diego has cashed 13 of the last 16 meetings as the road team, a streak that actually extends back to the Raiders days in Los Angeles. Norv Turner is on a overall 6-1 ATS run in division play. Against the Raiders, they've covered eight of nine. In the last three meetings here in Oakland, the Raiders have failed to come within 13 points even once. **3* on San Diego**

Baltimore at Pittsburgh Monday, September 29th, 8:30 ET

UPSET ALERT! This is a bad spot for a Pittsburgh team that is really banged up and is being asked to lay eight points in a tough division game. Certainly, no one

believes in the Ravens at 2-0, but they might after this one, as the blueprint to beat the Steelers, set forth by the Eagles last week, will be easy to follow for Ray Lewis and company.

Remember last year when the Eagles became just the second team to cover against New England in the regular season. Who played the Patriots the following week? Answer: Baltimore. The Ravens easily covered the double-digit number in that Monday Night affair, almost winning outright. The formula is simple: get pressure on the QB.

Just like getting to Brady was the answer to beating New England, getting to Ben Roethlisberger is the key to beating Pittsburgh. Making this task easier is the fact that the Steelers' offensive line is not what it once was due to the loss of Alan Faneca. This was readily apparent last week when the Eagles sacked Big Ben SIX times – in the second quarter!

Baltimore did lose all eight games on the road ATS last year, but that was last year. The defense has been reborn in 2008, allowing just 20 points in two games and one offensive touchdown. RB Willie Parker has been ruled out for this matchup and with the Steelers scoring just 16 points total over the last two weeks, they simply cannot score enough to cover this number. And as we mentioned before, covering the spread might not be Pittsburgh's only problem here. **3* on Baltimore**

Houston at East Carolina

Saturday, September 27th, 3:30 ET

Now that they have moved from the hunter to the hunted, East Carolina has had its fair share of problems. Their BCS aspirations were dashed last week with a come from ahead 30-24 overtime loss to NC State, a team that had previously been outscored 98-9 in its three previous games vs. lined opponents. The week before that they struggled against Tulane, winning by just four as 11.5-point favorites. The Pirates are once again laying double-digits this week against a Houston team that will be pretty angry coming off back-to-back three-point losses.

One reason that Houston looks pretty attractive is the fact they are averaging over 36 points per game this year. The only problem is that the defense is allowing nearly 30 PPG. That number would be even higher when you throw out a 55-3 win over FCS Southern. Over the last three weeks, they have allowed 56, 31 and 28 points respectively. However, ECU has not scored more than 28 points in any one game this season, instead taking a defensive approach. While they have been successful doing so, that's not really conducive to covering large spreads such as these.

This is also a revenge spot for the Cougars, who lost at home as 13-point favorites to East Carolina last year. Houston missed two FG's in the final two minutes of that game, ruining an incredible effort by WR Donnie Avery, who had 350 all-purpose yards. Take note that the visitor is 6-2 SU all-time in this series. The last time Houston paid a visit to Greenville was 2003 and they came away with a 27-13 win. This is a team that averages over 500 yards of offense per game, including nearly 400 through the air. **3* on Houston**

Purdue at Notre Dame

Saturday, September 27th, 3:30 ET

Why would Notre Dame be favored over anyone? The Fighting Irish have absolutely no offense. Maybe it's because they are 14-1 in South Bend in Purdue since 1976, but this isn't your older brother's Notre Dame team. If not for six Michigan turnovers two weeks ago, Charlie Weis' team would very likely be 1-2. If not for a

lucky San Diego State fumble at the goal line the week before, the Irish would very likely be 0-3.

Notre Dame has been outgained in all three games this year. They had just 16 yards rushing against Michigan State last week. Against Michigan, they had only 14 first downs and 260 total yards of offense and averaged just 3.3 yards per rush and completed less than 50% passing. In their last six quarters, this team has managed just 340 total yards of offense!

That won't get it done against a Purdue team that exhibited great balance in a loss to Oregon with 201 yards rushing and 207 yards passing. Last week, the offense looked very good in a 32-25 win over Central Michigan. The Boilermakers didn't cover that game (as we predicted they wouldn't in the EDGE last week!), but they showed they are a better offense than anything Notre Dame has seen this season.

Notre Dame is just 9-21 ATS coming off a road loss since 1992. This includes a 38-0 loss at Michigan last year that came on the heels of a 31-10 loss at Penn State the week prior. Last year's loss to Purdue put Notre Dame at 0-5 for the first time in school history as the Boilermakers put up 31 points on the scoreboard. Notre Dame was 0-9 SU (2-7 ATS) last year when allowing 27+ points. All of their wins came when they allowed 14 or less. Purdue is definitely scoring more than two touchdowns here. **3* on Purdue**

TCU at Oklahoma

Saturday, September 27th, 7:00 ET

This is a very intriguing matchup. When these teams last met (back in '05), TCU

handed the Sooners one of only two home losses during the entire Bob Stoops era (54-2 overall!), beating then #7 OU, 17-10, as 25-point underdogs. The Horned Frogs outgained the Sooners that day 284-215 and know that the host is just 2-8 all-time in this series.

Even more promising for TCU backers is that their team is winning by an average of 43.0 PPG to 7.7 PPG. They are #1 in the nation in defense. Getting almost three touchdowns from the oddsmakers sure looks pretty attractive here, no? After all, the Horned Frogs are 8-0 ATS when getting more than eight points as visitors!

Forget about it. This is a huge step up in class for TCU, whose four previous opponents include: New Mexico, Stephen F. Austin, Stanford and SMU. Not exactly a quartet of BCS contenders there. Oklahoma has just looked awesome so far this season and is coming off a bye to boot. They have outscored the opposition on average of 54.7-15.5. They are #1 in the nation in scoring average. They have also covered 9 of 12 at home when favored by 20 points or less.

Don't think for a second that Stoops doesn't remember the '05 loss. TCU actually has won its last two visits to Norman, also winning 20-7 in 1996. OU is 10-3 ATS L13 at home, 8-2 ATS in September and LY they went 3-0 ATS in non-conference play, covering spreads of 39 and 45, and outscored the opposition by a combined 184-26. **3* on Oklahoma**

Wisconsin at Michigan Saturday, September 27

Wisconsin is 3-0 Straight Up and 2-1 ATS to start the season crushing Akron and Marshall in their first two games. On September 13, the Badgers had a quality 13-10 win at Fresno St. Wisky had a bye last week and they are preparing for their Big 10 opener vs. Michigan. The Badgers have a huge advantage in this game as they return 17 starters from last year's team while Michigan returns just 10 starters that includes only 3 on offense. The Wolverines are 1-2 their first 3 games with a home loss to Utah, a home win over Miami Ohio, and 35-17 loss in South Bend against an average Notre Dame team. The big problem for Michigan is that first year head coach Rich Rodriguez has had losing records in his first year at his first three previous College coaching jobs. The reason for that is that his complicated spread offense takes a year or more to grasp.

Minnesota at Ohio State Saturday, September 27

As the Big 10 opens conference play this weekend, four schools enter unbeaten in their non-conference schedules. Penn State (4-0) and Wisconsin (3-0) are not surprises but Northwestern and Minnesota (both 4-0), sure are. The Gophers are the real surprise in '08, as in Tim Brewster's first year in Minneapolis, the not-so Golden Gophers ended the '07 season on a 10-game losing streak, finishing 1-11 SU and 4-7 ATS. The team finished 115th in pass D last year (289 YPG) and allowed 36.7 PPG, while finishing -15 in turnovers. Not many could have anticipated this year's 4-0 start, despite the fact that the schedule included home games with Northern Illinois, Montana St and FAU, plus a road game at Bowling Green. After all, BG won in Minnesota last year and FAU won the Sun Belt title in '07 plus last year's New Orleans Bowl over Memphis, to finish 8-5. However, led by sophomore QB Adam Weber (71.8% completions with seven TDs and one INT) and a running game which has averaged 162.0 YPG, the Gophers have averaged 36.3 PPG, while allowing just 17.5 PPG. As for Ohio State, the Buckeyes were humbled at USC two weeks ago and despite all the hype over Terelle Pryor's ascension to the starting QB slot last week against Troy (he went 10-16 with four TD passes plus ran for 66 yards), one can't ignore the fact that the Trojans actually outgained the Buckeyes in Columbus and OSU led just 14-10 in the 4th quarter before winning, 28-10. Remember, the 0-4 Ohio Bobcats also led OSU in Columbus into the 4th quarter on September 6! That being said, Minnesota is jumping way up in class in this game and let's note that the Gophers are just 2-33 vs Ohio State since 1969, including just 1-17 SU in Columbus. We've seen Ohio State "not measure up" in two straight BCS title games against elite teams from the SEC (Florida, then LSU) and at USC on September 13 but the Buckeyes are back in the Big 10 now. It's a conference they have dominated the last three seasons, going 22-2 SU and 18-6 ATS against from 2005-07. Lay the points with Ohio State.

Play on Ohio State

Troy at Oklahoma St Saturday, September 27

Troy completely embarrassed the Cowboys last season as they never saw the Trojans coming. Oklahoma St. lost that game by 18 points and the final score did not even tell the story as Troy had a 31-point lead entering the fourth quarter. The Trojans piled up 562 total yards in that game, but it is important to note that the two best offensive players, quarterback Omar Haugabook and running back Kenny Cattouse have moved on. The Trojans offense is not nearly the same as it was last season.

The Cowboys, meanwhile, come into this year a perfect 3-0 and the offense may be even better than last season. Oklahoma St. finished last season 7th in total offense and 22nd in scoring. This year, the Cowboys are currently 5th in both categories and they have improved their margins each game. Granted the last game came against Missouri St. but in the game prior to that, they racked up 699 yards of offense against Houston. They are rolling right now.

The cog to this offense is quarterback Zac Robinson as he is currently eighth in the country in passing efficiency. His first start as a Cowboy came last season in Troy and it was a game that he would like to forget as he was 18-37 for 191 yards with a touchdown and two interceptions. He no doubt remembers that game and would like nothing more than to turn it around here against the same team. Troy has been solid on defense but most of that success came against Alcorn St. in a 65-0 win.

Most of the offensive success came in that game as well as the Trojans put up 736 total yards of offense. In the other two games against Middle Tennessee and Ohio St., Troy tallied 300 and 315 yards respectively. The weakness of the Cowboys over the last few years has been the defense, but they have been solid thus far as they are 29th in total defense after coming in 101st last season. That stop unit has a point to prove this time around after getting humiliated on the road last year in Troy.

Offense will be the key as Oklahoma St. is 13-4 ATS over the last three seasons when it scores 28 or more points. The Cowboys have scored 56 and 57 points in their last two games and they are a perfect 10-0 ATS in their last 10 games after scoring 50 or more points since 1992. Since 2003, the average point differential in six games is +22.7 PPG. Troy meanwhile is 2-9 ATS in its last 11 games after two or more consecutive spread wins. Look for the Cowboys to get their revenge in a big way here.

Play on Oklahoma St

Matt Fargo is becoming recognized as one of the best and most consistent handicappers in the world. In his 14 years of handicapping, Fargo has had winning seasons 11 times and has not had only one losing season in the past 10 campaigns.

Arkansas at Texas Saturday, September 27

The Texas Longhorns and Arkansas Razorbacks will make up their previously scheduled game (which was postponed due to Hurricane Ike) this Saturday and the Longhorns have been installed as a 4-touchdown favorite. Texas has been playing great football, and has won and covered each of its three games so far, with an average score of 49-11.



Arkansas won its first two games, but was embarrassed at home last Saturday by Alabama, losing 49-14 as an eight-point underdog. Off that loss, let's take the Razorbacks plus the large number, as College Football favorites of 21 or more points are a dismal 53-83 ATS since 1980 off three consecutive wins and covers as a favorite. Buffalo at St Louis Sunday, September 28

I've been using totals for my EDGE selections this season and they've been extremely successful, including another winner in last week's edition. Last week's ticket was on the 'over' in the Bucs/Bears game. The total was 35 and the teams combined for 51 points! This week, we'll hope for some better defense, as our selection is on an 'under.' After three straight poor defensive performances to begin the season, the Rams will be trying to do whatever it takes to control the ball and keep the Bills' offense off the field. Note that while the Rams' defense has admittedly had some problems, the offense has also struggled to put points on the board. While the Bills are off to a great 3-0 start, they're still a team which relies heavily on it's defense to win football games. That's particularly true when playing on the road. In this season's lone road outing, the Bills traveled to Jacksonville and limited a strong Jaguars team to just 16 points, en route to a four-point victory. That game snuck below the number which brought the 'under' to 4-0 the Bills' last four road games and 8-2 the last 10. Looking back further and we find that the 'under' is a profitable 12-5 in Buffalo's 17 road games since the start of the 2006 season. Note that in their last seven road games, the Bills held six of their opponents to 17 points or less. Look for this Sunday's game to be lower-scoring than expected once again.

LSU at Mississippi St Saturday, September 27

I'm taking the points with Mississippi State on Saturday night. LSU is coming off their biggest win of the season, beating Auburn, 26-21. That's the same Auburn team that Mississippi State played evenly in a 3-2 defeat on September 13. I don't want to get too syllogistic here, but LSU needed all they could muster, including a handful of trickery to pull out the late win over Auburn. LSU has a bye next week, with a trip to Florida scheduled the following week. While they won't completely look past Mississippi State, it won't be that easy for the Tiger offense to sustain consistent drives against them. Let's not forget, that before MSU took a beating at Georgia Tech, they were playing their usual stout brand of defensive football.

The Bulldog offense gained more than 400 yards last week, but the team couldn't overcome four turnovers and a special teams gaffe...not to mention GA Tech's triple-option attack. But Sylvester Croom made a change at QB in the third quarter, going with backup Tyson Lee. The transfer signal-caller finished a decent 17-of-27 for 179 yards. He will add another dimension to the offense this week. It also must be noted that RB Anthony Dixon returned to the gridiron. Dixon ran for over 1,000 yards in 2007, and gained 94 yards on 13 carries, or 7.2 yards per carry against the Yellow Jackets. The Bulldogs also got a decent game from Brandon McRae who made 10 receptions for 102 yards. In other words, the offense should be at their healthiest and most dangerous, if you will, of the season, whether Wesley Carroll is under center or Tyson Lee.

There's no doubt that Croom's defense will come to play. Yes, they couldn't stop GA Tech. But the MSU offense did commit all of those turnovers mentioned above, and MSU had little time to prepare for HC Paul Johnson's unique (in this day and age) offense. This week, they'll take on an LSU offense that they are familiar with, and one that won't have the same quality-experience that it did a season ago. LSU is young at the skill positions and had their problems before resorting to trick plays a week ago.

I'm not saying that LSU fans should be overly concerned with an outright win this week. But the line is a good four points off thanks to last week's results. I do believe the Tigers will have a tough time remaining focused enough to cover this big number. They're also not nearly as strong on the offensive side of the football as they were last season. LSU has been overrated by the public for many years, as far as conference play and numbers are concerned. Backing the Tigers in home games against SEC opponents has been a 35% proposition for over a decade. Meanwhile, the Bulldogs are on a six-game spread win streak if they're playing away from home, following a spread loss. That's the case today.

I believe the outright winner in this game will not be in doubt. In fact, I have LSU winning this game by a score in the neighborhood of 23-13. But that 10-point margin would give Mississippi State backers nearly a two-touchdown win.

Denver at Kansas City Sunday, September 28

First, I would like to review last week's games. Is there any defense in this league? There were numerous come from behind miracles this past weekend. Tampa's QB Griese threw 67 times and was not sacked once. He put together THREE scoring drives totaling 232 yards in the 4th quarter and OT to defeat the Bears. The 3-0 Bills went on drives of 96 and 69 yards in the 4th quarter to defeat the Raiders. Even the Giants gave up drives of 82 and 71 yards late in the 4th quarter to the Bengals and had to fight them off in OT. The Broncos and Saints combined for 66 points, which is 18 points higher than the league per game average to this point in the season.

The only game that was low scoring was a physical smash mouth game in Philadelphia. The Eagles won 15-6 over the Steelers and it was also a 7* Monster loser for my clients. NFC East teams are a perfect 8-0 out of the division to this point.

Let's talk about this week's Denver/Kansas City game. Ai Simulator shows a 72% probability that KC will lose this game by 9 or fewer points and a 48% probability they will win the game. This game shapes up quite similar in scope to that of the Miami upset in New England. That Dolphins 5* Monster winner was huge for our clients as it also included a 1.5* amount on the money line. So, yes the AiS called for the upset and it is warranted for this game as well. I would recommend an additional 1* amount on the money.

Supporting this grade play is a system that has produced a mark of 94-44 ATS for 68% since 1983. Play on home dogs with a winning % of .250 or less if they failed to cover the spread in 2 out of their last 3 games and are playing a team with a winning record. Denver is off to great 3-0 start, but their recent offensive success works against them this week in a big way. Note that Denver is 0-10 ATS after gaining 6 or more yards/play in their previous game over the last 2 seasons. Even the posted total works against Denver noting they are 0-8 ATS in all games where the total is between 42.5 and 49 points over the last 2 seasons. The KC defense has been torched for years, but that works in their favor this week. Note that KC is 13-4 ATS (+8.6 Units) in home games after allowing 35 points or more last game since 1992. Take Kansas City and look for the upset as well.
